# HDFS 313 Module 2: Class Participation 2a: Cultural Framings of Puberty & Biological Development

This assignment has 2 parts. Part A is to be done independently, prior to class on Tuesday, and Part B will be done during class on Tuesday.

### **Activity**

Cultural Framings of Puberty & Biological Development

#### **Purpose**

Aside from the rapid changes that occur during the first 2 years of life, adolescence is a period of rapid and marked physical changes. In contrast to the changes that occur during infancy, however, the individual experiencing changes during adolescence has a heightened awareness of self, and sometimes the changes that occur can contribute to a sense of isolation. In this assignment, we will consider the cultural framings and responses to physical changes that can occur during adolescence.

This assignment addresses the following Module Learning Outcomes:

- Discuss concerns to adolescent health, wellness, and safety.
- Analyze the impact of cultural and environmental influences on physical and sexual development in adolescence.
- Examine cultural variations in the roles and importance of pubertal changes.

#### Instructions

This assignment has 2 parts. Please carefully read the instructions for each part. Part A: Case Study

1. Look for an example of a video (TikTok, YouTube Shorts, Reels on social media platform) blog post, news article, or other type of resource where either, (a) a youth discusses rites of passage associated with puberty, or physical changes they are experiencing during adolescence as a result of biological development and/or puberty; or (b) a friend, teacher, parent, sibling, family member, etc. discusses physical changes they are observing in someone else that is likely the result of biological development and/or puberty. For example, you might find a

- person who discusses <u>changes in their skin texture and acne</u>, or a parent who demonstrates how to shave.
- 2. Bring the example to class on Tuesday. You will need your example to complete Part B during class.

Part B: Discussion of cultural framing

During class the instructor will post questions to be discussed in pairs or small groups, and a Padlet for your group to post a summary of the discussion.
