Board of Education Approves Historic MOU Surrounding Future of Kettering's D.L. Barnes Building

KETTERING, OH – [August 5, 2025] – Following the signing by the Kettering Board of Education of a Memorandum of Understanding at its meeting Tuesday night, the Kettering City School District is pleased to announce a groundbreaking partnership that will see the historic Barnes Building rehabilitated and renovated at absolutely no cost to Kettering City School District taxpayers. This innovative collaboration, a first of its kind, brings together the Kettering City Schools, the Schiewetz Foundation, the City of Kettering, and COhatch to create a lasting benefit for the Kettering community and the broader Miami Valley region for years to come.

"It's rare to have the opportunity to collaborate on a project of this magnitude, and we are thrilled about this partnership and the incredible transformation of the Barnes Building," said Kettering City Manager Matt Greeson. "This project represents everything we strive for in Kettering – preserving our heritage, working together with the schools and other community partners, all while fostering innovation and economic growth. COhatch will provide our entrepreneurs and business owners with the resources and collaborative environment they need to succeed, while ensuring this historic landmark continues to serve our community for generations to come."

This unique and pilot-worthy initiative will transform the iconic Barnes Building – a community landmark since 1929 – without placing any financial burden on school district taxpayers. The project safeguards the district's resources, allowing it to remain focused on educational purposes, while retaining ownership of and oversight over the building and its programming and usage.
