Instructional Time: Semester-Block

Prerequisite: Studio Art

Grades: 11-12

**Required Materials Supplies:** One sketchbook or unlined journal (prefer book bound or spiral), a pencil (not mechanical, drawing pencils if you prefer-not required), and an eraser!

**Honors Art (Level 3 + 4)** is an advanced course that continues to expose students with a high interest in art to a more advanced and focused study. Advanced techniques and medium combinations will be explored. Projects/work in class will be completed in hope of having a portfolio at the end of the year. It is a requirement that students use the time and complete all assignments since this is a higher level course. Serious art students should inquire/enroll.

**Teacher will supply a supply pack!**

**Grading:** Students will be assessed based on the quality of engagement and the degree to which the student meets the products' expectations. Students report card letter grade will be based on a combination of the following criteria:

- > **Focused Works:** (30%)- Each project will include objectives and assessment. Projects may vary in points value. This category will include assessment, objectives met, craftsmanship, and an overall understanding of the process and techniques being addressed within the work. ZEROES WILL BE ISSUED FOR ALL PROJECTS WORKED ON OUTSIDE OF THE CLASSROOM. Permission is given for exceptions. 5 points per day will be deducted after the deadline/2 day grace period ex. Due Monday, turned in Wednesday 10 points will be deducted
- > **Sketchbook+Research:** (40%)- This will include sketchbook notes, project ideas, and issued assignments that are to be placed within the sketchbook. Sketchbooks are to be completed outside of the classroom setting. 2 points will be deducted per day after the due date, NO sketchbook will be accepted after one week has passed
- > **Studio Habits+Critiques:** (30%)- class readiness, participation, use of material, studio upkeep, critique participation

**\*What does engaged time mean?**

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**Rules:** In addition to the rules outlined in the CHS Student Handbook, it is imperative that students understand, read, and respect all rules:

1. Create Art during class Studio Time.
2. Stay in YOUR seat unless supplies are being gathered/put away.
3. Maintain an acceptable class noise level.
4. Respect the Art space and everyone inside it (including belongings).
5. Pay attention during explanation/instruction.

**Procedures:** I have included a few explanations of certain procedures to clarify a working Studio space in regards to the above rules.

Bathroom Breaks/Leaving the class: Use other times to leave the classroom, there will be a sign-out sheet and all students MUST be given permission to leave

Food & Drink: WATER ONLY, please do not eat

Language: All students are expected to use appropriate language at all times. No cursing, bullying, or teasing will be tolerated inside the class or at school.

Clean-Up: ALL students are responsible for cleaning up their supplies and area. NO exceptions or excuses. All supplies are to be cleaned and put back in the designated area. Cleaning and taking care of supplies will be part of the participation grade. \*Open Studio Communication for all classes\*

Use of Materials: Resources are limited, so PLEASE use the materials you need. Do not waste materials or break materials. This is very important and will only hinder the project flexibility.

Vandalism: There will be ZERO tolerance for vandalism of other students' work or items belonging to Carrboro High School or individuals.

Studio Work Outside of Class Time: The Art room/Studio time is for your BENEFIT, please keep this in mind when making the decision to use the time in class for other responsibilities. Ultimately, zeroes are given for work completed outside the classroom unless it is a sketchbook assignment.

**Discipline:** The student acknowledges the posted classroom expectations/policies. If a student ignores these rules and chooses to act inappropriately, the student assumes responsibility for the following consequence:

1. Verbal Warning
2. Lunch Detention
3. Parent Contact
4. Administrative Referral
