Recruitment

- **Scout Encampment** at Holland Park (Monkey Bridge, Smores, hotdogs, etc).
- **Trunk-or-treat:** Have trick-or-treaters play a game to earn candy, like a Minute to Win It game or bean bag toss
- **Scavenger Hunt:** Organize a scavenger hunt in a local park or wooded area. Create clues related to Scouting knowledge, knots, or outdoor skills. Teams can compete to find hidden items or complete challenges.
- **Campfire Cooking Challenge** (pair up Webelos with Scouts): Host a campfire cooking competition. Scouts can prepare simple meals using camp stoves or open flames. Judges (perhaps troop leaders or experienced Scouts) can evaluate taste, creativity, and presentation.
- **Obstacle Course:** Set up an obstacle course with various physical challenges. Include tasks like crawling under ropes, climbing over logs, and balancing on narrow beams. Scouts can race against the clock or compete in teams.
- **Knot-Tying Relay:** Teach essential knots (such as square knots, bowline knots, and clove hitches) and organize a relay race. Each Scout must tie a specific knot correctly before passing the rope to the next teammate.
- **Nature Art:** Encourage Scouts to create art using natural materials they find outdoors. This could include leaf rubbings, pinecone animals, or rock sculptures. Display their creations for parents and potential recruits to see.
- **Geocaching Adventure:** Introduce geocaching—a modern treasure hunt using GPS coordinates. Hide small containers (geocaches) in your area, and provide clues for Scouts to find them. It's a great way to combine technology and outdoor exploration.
- **STEM Challenges:** Incorporate science, technology, engineering, and math (STEM) activities. Build simple catapults, design paper airplanes, or construct mini-rafts to test in a nearby stream.
- **Outdoor Movie Night:** Set up an outdoor movie screening in your troop's meeting area or a local park. Show a family-friendly film related to adventure, teamwork, or Scouting values. Invite potential recruits and their families.

Here are some tips for creating a BSA recruitment event:

- Log in to your council's Facebook page
- Click on Events
- Create an event
- Enter event information
- Boost the event after it's posted
- Use high resolution graphics
- Target junior high, middle schools, and high schools
- Add small details, like the room number or specific location
- Don't change the event after it's posted
