POLICY STATEMENT

The counseling office shall ensure that final assignments meet student needs (including those designated in Individual Education Plans, 504s, Gifted Student Service Plans, as well as other concerns). All assignments shall be made in accordance with applicable district and state guidelines and laws.

Sixth Grade Classes

Sixth grade students will be enrolled in the following full year core courses: mathematics, science, social studies, and language arts.

Each semester, students will be enrolled in two of the rotation offerings. Students enrolled in chorus, orchestra, and/or band will have a reduced number of options for rotation classes.

Seventh Grade Classes

Seventh grade students will be enrolled in the following full year core courses: mathematics, science, social studies, and language arts.

Each semester, students will be enrolled in two of the rotation offerings. Students enrolled in chorus, orchestra, band, Spanish I, and/or Chinese I will have a reduced number of options for rotation classes.

Eighth Grade Classes

Eighth grade students will be enrolled in the following full year core courses: mathematics, science, social studies, and language arts.

Each semester, students will be enrolled in two of the rotation offerings. Students enrolled in chorus, orchestra, band, Spanish I, Media Production and/or Chinese I will have a reduced number of options for rotation classes.

Remediation Classes-RTI and Core Support Classes

When funding is available and as the master schedule permits, students performing consistently below grade level in math and/or reading shall be placed in a remediation class. Placement in the class will be based upon, but not limited to, the following criteria: MAP, KPREP, classroom performance, repeating of a grade level (retention), and/or progress monitoring data.

**Students may return to regular rotation courses based upon student performance.

Students from the family of an active duty service member

The placement of students from the household of an active duty service member transferring into the district before or during the school year shall be based initially on enrollment in courses offered at the sending school and/or educational assessment conducted at that school.
