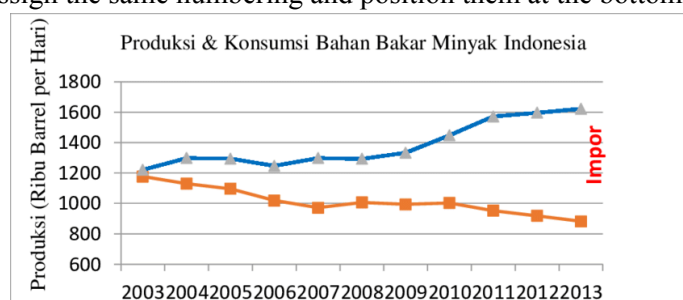


Figure 2. Oil Production and Consumption in 2003-2013
