

Week 1 (5th Jan 2020):

The Big Point: I Have Victory through Jesus!

God's Word: Peter Heals a Crippled Beggar (Acts 3: 1-10)

Memory Verse: But let us give thanks to God! He gives us the victory because of what our

Lord Jesus Christ has done. 1 Corinthians 15:57

Application: I can do great things with the little I have, knowing Jesus has won for me.

Welcome NEW kids in your LG.
Introduce NEW kids with one another.

Happy 2020!!! New year, new school (some of you) and new friends. Ask kids how they feel about NEW friends, NEW schools ...

This year, our church will learn that WE HAD WON! And we know that GOD had won the battle for us.

The Big Point: I Have Victory through Jesus!

Re-cap what kids had learnt on sunday: Peter Heals a Crippled Beggar (Acts 3: 1-10)

This lesson plan is based on the Bible passage in Acts 3 when Peter heals a crippled man. It's an important story because it shows how the power and Spirit of Jesus continues his work through the church. From this lesson children will learn how they can be ready to share what they know about Jesus with other people.

Part 1: Show the shoe again. Read Acts 3:1 and 2. Say, The man couldn't work because he wouldn't walk. so every day, he sat by the temple and begged for the money he needed to support himself.

Part 2: Show the bag of change and read Acts 3:3-5. Say, Money was precious to this man. He relied on the kindness of others to give him the money that he needed. When Peter stopped and talked to him, he thought that Peter was going to give him money. Let's see what Peter really gives the man.

Part 3: Show the Bible and read Acts 3:6-10. Say, Peter gave the man the gift of knowing Jesus. He showed him the power of God by giving him the ability to walk. The man was healed and was finally able to walk. When he was healed he was overjoyed and went throughout the city telling everyone he could about Jesus.

The crippled man learned an important lesson that day. Money was able to help him buy things, but only Jesus Christ could truly heal him.

Reviewing the lesson: Say, When the crippled beggar saw Peter the most he was hoping for was a few pennies, but God had over plans for his life. Peter showed him who the true healer was and that is Jesus Christ. Through Jesus and amazing thing was done in the life of that man. He was healed physically and was finally able to walk. Isn't that amazing? When the man was healed he praised God for healing him. What are some things that you can thank God for in your life? What has God done for you? Have the children sit in a circle and toss a beach ball back and forth between them. When they catch the ball, they must say something that God has done in their lives or something that they are thankful for. Play until everyone has had a turn or until they lose interest.

Closing: Close the lesson by praying and thanking God for the all of the things that He has done in the lives of the children. Ask God to bless the money that the children are donating to charity and pray that He would be with the children throughout the week and that they would be encouraged to tell others about Jesus.

Lesson Aim: To have the children remember that Jesus' resurrection is the ultimate victory. If they have Jesus, they have the victory which gives them strength to do anything.


