- 1. RIDGS Research Workshops: The Center for RIDGS Studies is committed to fostering new and emerging research, providing space for experimental inquiry and skill building, and creating collaborative scholarly groups within and outside the University.
- 2. RIDGS Critical Reading Groups: Race, Indigeneity, Disability, Gender, and Sexuality Studies are all rapidly expanding fields. It can be difficult to stay up-to-date on all of the canonical as well as new, cutting-edge texts, which can lead to scattershot understandings of the fields. The Center for RIDGS Studies' Critical Reading Groups are intended to help students fill in gaps which they have identified in their studies.

Each year, RIDGS is sponsoring a few student or faculty-led groups of graduate and undergraduate students (ranging in size from 4-10 participants) to (1) pursue a concrete research question or (2) read and discuss a syllabus of texts of their choosing. At the end of the year, students will write a short (1) progress report outlining what research steps they have taken and what they have learned or (2) a "state of the field" essay, describing how their texts have shaped the field as well as how they have and still could be used to inform political, social, and economic action in the past and future. Groups must apply and, if accepted, will receive funding from \$200-\$1000, depending on the number of participants and demonstrated need, to be used for books, snacks, and relevant films, museum visits, or other activities. Additional funding may be made available for extraordinary and justifiable expenses.

Applications will be accepted on a rolling basis, but priority will be given to applications received before October 4, 2024.

Funding priority will be given to proposals with:

- 1) Detailed descriptions of planned activities tied to research or learning goals that support innovation in RIDGS fields in clear and compelling ways.
- 2) Demonstrated participant interest and/or a strong target audience for the proposed workshop/group. (Workshops/groups that connect RIDGS to new communities and participants are encouraged.)
- 3) Budgets that demonstrate thoughtful use of RIDGS funds with an attention to balancing requested resources with potential impact. (Highly successful workshops/groups don't always require large budgets.)
- 4) Research/reading plans which cross disciplinary boundaries as well as those which include texts which build on one another.

Sometimes a research workshop will fail to take off. Prior failure does not preclude applicants from current or future funding.
