

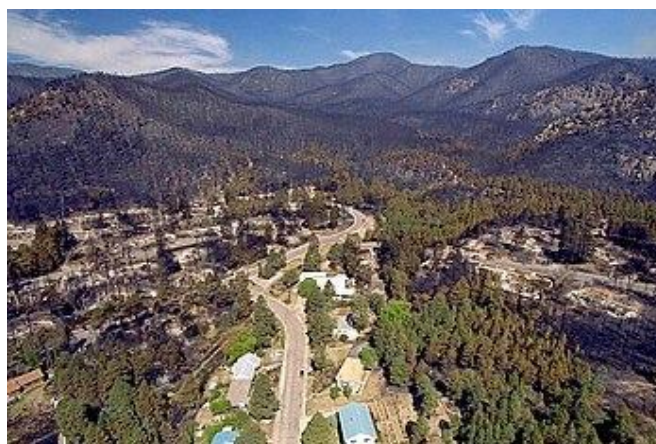
New Mexico Rally and Barbecue
