Activities

- Analysis and discussion of texts, bibliographic research activities, discussions/debates, processing/interpretation of graphs and tables, preparation of written reports, dossier processing, view/discuss videos, role plays and dramatizations, analysis of advertisements.
- Class is carried out only in Spanish (no other languages used) developing a direct, situational, and communicative method, looking for mental associations between concept and text. Vocabulary and grammar are studied in a contextual way, placing particular emphasis on the students' participation both written and oral. Teachers use exercises for different grammatical structures, dictations, and readings, paying special attention to phonetics and pronunciation, creating controlled yet free conversation, with instructor guidance/facilitation. This course has been developed following the directives of the European Common Reference Framework for Languages (Council of Europe) and the Curricula Plan of the Cervantes Institute.

Methodology
