- Students will be given an opportunity to submit evidence for two weeks following a unit of study. Reassessments may not be available for the final Skills Assessment.

Assessment Information

- Assessments will include written tests as well as projects that will be required to be completed in order to pass the course. All class projects and assessments need to be completed in order to demonstrate class competencies and to pass the course.
- Reassessments can occur for each assessment for up to 2 weeks from the date of the assessment. In order to reassess, all missing work related to the assessment must be completed. Students will need to arrange a time to meet with the instructor to create a learning plan to reteach the concepts that the student is struggling with. You may be required to complete additional practice in order to reassess within that two week time frame. After all requirements are met, the student may reassess.
- Students are encouraged to turn in their work on time. If an assignment is turned in late, it is the students' responsibility to inform the teacher that the late or missing assessment was turned in.
- Depending on the assignment, make-up work can be completed at home utilizing on-line tools or at school. Students may come in before or after school by appointment. A time will need to be scheduled with the instructor. Please plan in advance if you know that you will be absent from class.

- Safety is of the utmost importance in this class and students are expected to know and abide by all safety rules at all times.
- Students who do not follow safety rules will be asked to leave the classroom. Repeat offenders may be expelled from this class because they put themselves and others at risk.
