0	Must be specifically designed for rock climbing (UIAA Rated) and less than 10 years old/not heavily worn (<i>if any uncertainty, please touch base with us</i>)
0	Should have at least 4 gear loops

0	UIAA rated- no ski or bike helmets (unless triple rated)

0	Comfortable, all-around shoes would be ideal, multiple shoes can be nice but not necessary. One for single pitch and one for multi pitch.

0	Must have 2 rope channels and an extra "ear" for direct belay application (reach out to staff if any questions)

0	At least 3 "pear-shaped" HMS carabiners (<i>Petzl Attache, Edelrid HMS Strike</i>) At least 1 smaller locker but 2 is nice (Trango Superfly, Camp Photon Locking)
