## Chapter 3-6

1. Olan's character is further developed in these chapters. She is now proud, independent, stubborn, and resourceful. Find the evidence from the story to prove this.

To the Chinese, the color 'red' carries special significance and is used for in all types of ceremonies. For example, Wang Lung bought red dye to color the eggs in celebration of the birth of his first son. O-lan dressed her son in red silk before presenting him to the Old Mistress. In wedding ceremonies, the bride is always dressed in red. In Chapter 5, to celebrate the New Year, red papers are used to good luck signs, and to make new clothes for the gods. Red signs are put on the doorway and various items of furniture, and people burn two red candles in the event of New Year.

Wang Lung and his wife are superstitious. Upon traveling towards his home from house of Hwang, Wang Lung was exulted because he had a beautiful male child whose face was seen under the open sky. He did this to ward off any evil spirits which might affect his rise. After Wang Lung had said his child was a mere girl, she also agreed with him because she understood what her husband had done.

The Great House of Hwang unable to stand forever because five of the young lords spend money extravagantly in the foreign parts and send woman after woman home after they are tired of

them. Furthermore, Old Lord living at home adds one or two concubines each year, and the Old Mistress consumes opium daily which is very costly.

## Chapter 10-11

1. How much influence does Wang Lung's little girl child have on him?

Wang Lung's little girl has a big influence on him because she was born in a drought, and he fed her with chewed beans given by Ching. Furthermore, the fact he held her close to his chest prevents him from selling her as a slave in the Southern city when he is desperate for money to return home. - In Anhwei, where Wang Lung was born, the language is slow and deep and it wells from the throat. However, in Kiangsu city, where they now lived, people speak in syllables which splinter from their lips and from the ends of their tongues.
- In his homeland, the bearing of the fields is slow and the land is harvested twice a year of wheat and rice and a bin of corn, beans, and garlic. However, in his present home, the farms are fed with fertilizers made of human wastes to hurry the bearing of the vegetable besides the rice.
- In his homeland, people eat only a piece of white bread with a bit of garlic. However, in his present home, people eat pork balls, bamboo sprouts, and many other delicacies.

- 4. Compare and contrast the rich and the poor throughout these chapters.
- 5. Based on what evidence can we make assumption that there could be unrest in the southern city?

There are three main evidences that we can make assumption that there could be unrest in the southern city. First, there are soldiers wandering around the city searching for able-bodied to join the military. Second, there is a young man who speaks of revolution in public; he condemns the rich and would divide the wealth of the rich among the poor if the revolution succeeded. Also, there is an old man from the family in an adjoining hut who maintains that 'when the rich are too rich, there is a way, and if I am not mistaken that way will come soon.' Finally, there is uprising when the gates of the rich are broken and the poor pour into the house to pillage.

Point to consider:

Questions to be considered:

1. Describe the moving order of the family into the big house. What significance it carries?
