The Board of Directors for the Indiana Foreign Language Teachers Association, Inc. met on Zoom at 10am on May 18, 2024. A quorum was declared by President Brandon Fitzsimmons.

- II. **Secretary's Report** – Melinda White: working to resolve the email authentication emails and clean up the account. (Does NOT think that the extra emails for Advocacy have caused any extra stress. They are necessary.) No feedback about changes to the minutes from the last meeting on March 2. Megan moved to approve the minutes. Ye seconded. Candis Carey abstained from the vote since she was not present at the March meeting. Everyone else voted unanimously, so the motion carried.
  
- III. **Treasurer's Report** – Kazumi Matsumoto

Discussion: how many donations were received at the Spring Conference. Brandon looked at the bank records (Kazumi not present at the time) \$85. Zelle account now set up for donations and membership not related to Conference fees. Megan moved to approve the treasurer report, Candis seconded. Motion carried.

#### IV. **IFLTA Fall Conference(s) Updates**

a. **Name Badges for Exec. Board Members** - Ye Sun

Sun Ye would like to get official name badges for the 5 Exec. Board members and a few key Conference Chairs (like Technology and Exhibits) so we are more easily recognized at the conference. Priced at \$15 per tag. Ye and Kazumi will make a plan for purchasing them. Oddly, I did not write down who moved that we approve this purchase, but Melinda seconded. All approved.

b. **2024 Conference Proposal Form and Process** - Megan Worcester

There are 25 current session proposals for our fall conference. We will send out another reminder call. We have space for 56 sessions.

c. **Registration and Presentation deadlines** - Megan Worcester

Discussion: who has minimal representation currently at the conference and should we encourage certain groups to participate (Need Latin and ASL representation, based on the graphs Megan has from registration data).

d. **Conference Costs and Reservations** - Megan Worcester

Proposal to increase conference fees to \$185 Regular, Early-Bird registration, \$130 Student, \$170 retiree, \$200 Late registration, \$150 for Saturday only, and \$20/\$25 for the Thursday Evening Workshop (depending on cost of food). Melinda moved to accept the cost increase, Ye seconded, all approved.

e. **T-shirt Sales** – Megan Worcester Previously proposed and accepted idea to use t-shirt sales for Advocacy fundraising. The design was never agreed upon. 2 choices presented, one was controversial last year. Suggestion to use last year's Poster contest winning design on t-shirt. Ye will get the design to Megan; Megan will send design choices out to Board for a vote; She needs the official choice by May 31<sup>st</sup>, so it will get done this week; Brandon and Megan will both check pricing with their local small business printers; suggestion to use a union printing shop to support responsible labor management and organized labor; agreed that this is a worthy idea but suggested that

supporting small businesses is also a worthy cause; looking to see if local shop is unionized was considered (but is not a deal breaker).

f. **Pre-conference and New Teacher Workshop** - (Vacated - Brandon Fitzsimmons/Charlene Heinzman)

Discussion: Pre-conference workshop has been our extension workshop for the last few years. Chunmei Guan and one more person attended the extension workshop for us and should be planning to teach this if they want reimbursed for the Central States Conference. Suggestion to move pre-teacher workshop to Thursday night, if students win new teacher scholarship then they would also get this workshop paid with regular conference registration. (Extension workshop would move to regular session time). Melinda moved, Candis seconded, approved.
