Parents and Guardians Have Legal Rights in Schools



SCHOOL SAFETY & DISCIPLINE

Supervision of students on school grounds

- We strive to maintain a safe and supportive school environment
- We investigate reports or evidence of misbehavior
- Civil rights laws, Title IX, and thorough investigation address bullying



EQUITY, DIVERSITY, AND INCLUSION

Creating safe spaces

- Schools will create respectful and inclusive spaces where every person feels a sense of belonging.
- All members of the school community will have equitable access and opportunity across race, class, ethnicity, gender, sexual orientation, religion, ability, and language.



SECTION 504

Provides access to education & activities for eligible students

- To be eligible, a student must have a physical or mental impairment that substantially limits one or more life activities.
- Parents have the right to request an evaluation to determine their child's eligibility for a 504 plan.
- Parents and the school team collaborate to make decisions about the accommodations needed for the student to access instruction or activities similarly to non-disabled peers
- Examples of accommodations include visual aids, extended time, and small group testing.



Special Education

Parent and Students have rights in special education

- Parents have the right to request an evaluation if their student is not making adequate progress academically, behaviorally, or in the development of their speech/language skills.
- Evaluation and eligibility are made by a team that includes parents and school professionals, based on data and a body of evidence.
- Accommodations, goals, and services are determined as a team and reviewed annually.



Gifted and Talented

Appropriate Programming

- Schools gather information using assessments like the Cognitive Abilities
 Test and a body of evidence to identify advanced abilities.
- Four norm-referenced assessments showing scores at or above the 95th percentile indicate eligibility for an Advanced Learning Plan.
- Parents may inquire about district resources, acceleration, and early access for their child.
