

MiVoice Voting Guide Autumn 2025

Overview

We hope that everyone reading this guide is excited for our Autumn Conference this year!

The purpose of this guide is to outline how to vote on Conference motions as an online viewer using Mi-Voice. You may have already used this system to vote during previous internal elections.

To vote you will need a unique voting code (UVC) which should have been sent to you after registration and the night before Conference.

If you do not know what your UVC is, please visit https://www.mi-vote.com/secure/ldconfautumn25 and enter the email address you used to register for Conference in the "Send me my voting code" section. Your UVC will be sent to you by email.

Here you will be prompted to enter your UVC on a page like the below:


Welcome to the Liberal Democrat's voting site for the 2025 Autumn Conference

This site will allow you to access the Conference Voting Site by entering your unique voting code below. Alternatively, if you cannot locate your voting credentials, request that they be resent by entering the email address you registered to attend the Conference below.

Once you have entered your code in the "Vote Now" section, you will be sent to another page that will have the name of the event your code is related to at the top. In this case, it will be "Autumn 2025 Online Voting".

Here you will see that there are two tabs, one for open contests and the other for completed contests as shown below.



Do not be alarmed if there are no available contests - this will happen during debates and when voting is not currently open.

Important information


While watching the event there will be times where the Chair opens a vote. Please note the following key information about voting:

- Each vote will be open for at least 90 seconds.
- The Chair will indicate when online voting has opened.
- Online voting may open before voting in the auditorium to allow time for everyone to vote.
- Voting will usually take place on amendments followed by main motions sequentially.
- Where possible, online voting will open during summation.


How to vote

When this happens our team will open the vote on Mi-Voice as well. You will need to refresh the Mi-Voice page you are on to see this update.

After refreshing you should see an open contest which will look like this:



Then you will need to press the "SELECT" button to go to the voting page. You will then be greeted by a page like this:



You will just need to click one of the options and then press "Next step".

This will take you to the next page where you will need to confirm your vote, it will look like the below image.

Confirmation

Below are the option(s) that you have selected.

If you are happy with your selection(s), please click the 'Cast My Vote Now' button at the bottom of the page to submit your vote.

If you would like to change your choices, please click the 'Previous step' option below.

Please note that once you have clicked the 'Cast My Vote Now' button, your vote will be counted, and you will not be able to return to the voting site.



Here you will be able to see your vote and confirm by pressing "Cast My Vote Now".

You will be moved back to the original page you were on after this.

The contest you voted on will then be moved to the tab "closed contests" as well as any other votes you have voted in as shown below.



It is important to remember to refresh your page anytime a vote is opened.
