

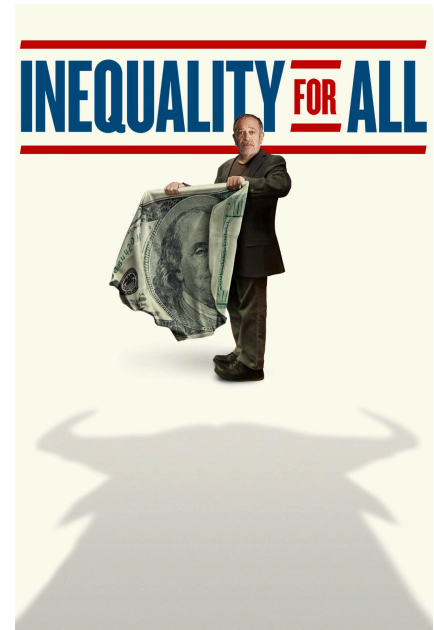
Inequality for All
