<u>Task 2:</u> Find one play that would be appropriate to share with the class in September - this will then become a choice for an extract that you can perform for your Component 3 exam.
The Rules: (AQA demands)
Texts cannot be within the same time period of context of our set texts: Antigone or Metamorphosis.
There must be at least a monologue or a duologue in the script so that we can maintain social distancing.
The play must have been professionally produced/performed.
Texts must offer the possibility to show a range of theatrical skills so the full range of marks can be accessed.
FOLLOW UP:
Your building work will be assessed in the following way:
<b>High</b> - Demonstrates sustained, focused, and insightful investigation of texts with critical analysis. Ideas and observations are recorded consistently and thoughtfully, showing clear

relevance to the text and how you understand the social and historical context will affect

performance choices. Reflection is perceptive and drives meaningful exploration. When discussing and choosing your three plays in September, choices are well informed and relevant.

**Mid**- Shows a reasonable level of investigation and some critical engagement with plays explored. Ideas and observations are recorded adequately with some relevance to social, historical context to inform character creation. Reflection is present but may lack depth or consistency. When discussing and choosing thee plays in September information is relevant but could be more detailed. Work shows personal engagement but could be more focused or detailed.

**Low Mid**- Investigation and use of contextual sources are limited or descriptive rather than analytical. Recording of ideas and observations is inconsistent or superficial, with limited reflection on social and historical context. Discussions on text are superficial. Personal engagement is weak and ideas may be underdeveloped or unclear.

**Low**- Very limited or no investigation of ideas or contextual sources. Recording is sparse or irrelevant with little or no reflection. Work lacks personal focus or coherence.
