## **Supplies:**

- 5 breakout boxes
- 5 directional locks
- 5 four letter boxes
- 5 pencil pouches
- 5 small bags (could be ziplock) with enough legos to write the url.
- Candy (for in the pencil pouch).
- Hint cards
- Brag signs for taking photos after a group has broken out.

## (Old School) Tools Used In This BreakoutEDU:

- <u>Canva</u> (for images like the time capsule).
- Fodey (to create the fake newspaper article.
- Pixabay (for CC0 images like the box w/items in it)
- Google Forms (with data validation).
- Google Drawings (for meme activity).
- <u>Powtoon</u> (for video about top books of 2017)
- <u>Calculator1</u> (to add up "Nugg Stats).
- Fake Ticket Generator (for Guns N Roses receipt)
- Answer Garden (for Guns N Roses survey)
- Google Sheets (for spreadsheet participants have to fill out).
- Big Huge Labs (to create grumpy cat image)

#### Notes:

- I always introduce the breakout by stating my goals for the activity. In this case it would be: "I want you to know more AFTER the activity (than you did before) about "various roles, strategies, and types of professional learning" and I want you to know more AFTER the activity (than you did before) about BreakoutEDU." I emphasize that I don't want them to be able to pass a test on the content, but I want some items to have a) stuck with them and b) for this to become a cognitive connection later. (Ex: "remember that resource in the breakout? Now we're going to talk more about \_\_\_\_\_.")
- I always point out the link to "common breakout tricks" on the main page. There are no clues here, but there are tips/tricks for helping them figure out how clues might be hidden.
- They MUST break the digital locks before breaking the physical locks on/in the box.

5 Letter Digi Lock	BRAVO	<ul> <li>Participants click on time capsule.</li> <li>Then click on/read article about the jobs of the future.</li> <li>Then Open Google Draw activity.</li> <li>When the drag over the title text in step 3, the word BRAVO is revealed.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Google Draw activity - drag and drop need laptops, not iPads</li> <li>Direct link to page w/Google Draw Activity</li> <li>Participants need to drag over the existing text and not create their own text box.</li> </ul>
8 Number Digi Lock	18100172	<ul> <li>Participants click on the hot spot in the RSS feed image in the box of stuff from the time capsule.</li> <li>Then click on the tweet from Carter Wilkerson.</li> <li>Clicking on the Twitter Bird will provide them with a digital calculator to use.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>How many days did it take for Carter's tweet to surpass         @EllenDeGeneres' Oscar Tweet as the most retweeted tweet of all time? (Be sure to use the day tweeted and the day Carter reached his goal in your total!) 34</li> <li>How many tweets did Wendy's tell Carter he'd have to get in order to get his nuggs? 18,000,000</li> <li>How much did Wendy's donate in Carter's name to the Dave Thomas Foundation for Adoption (@DTFA), which finds loving homes for children in foster care? \$100,000</li> <li>How many followers did Carter have on April 1st, prior to beginning his quest for nuggs? 138</li> </ul>
5 Number Digi Lock	11496	<ul> <li>Participants click on hotspot located in record album in the box of stuff that was in the Time Capsule.</li> <li>The Guns N Roses Ticket leads them to an article about Guns and Roses being the top artists on tour in 2017.</li> <li>The photo of Slash takes them to a video about how to hide text in a breakout.</li> <li>The Answer Garden asks them to submit their favorite Guns N Roses Song.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>In the spreadsheet, answering the questions in order is a must.</li> <li>One of the answers will require that they go back to the breakout and read the article about the Guns N Roses concert.</li> </ul>

The hidden text at the bottom forces them to make

		a copy of a Google Spreadsheet - which they must complete in order to solve the lock.	
4 Letter Digi Lock	THUG	<ul> <li>Participants will click on hot spot on the book in the box of items from the Time Capsule.</li> <li>Then they will watch the powtoon.</li> <li>The combination is near the end of the powtoon. It is pointed out with an arrow.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Hotspots might be a struggle for participants to fine. Encourage them to keep moving their mice around the area.</li> </ul>
Directional Lock (on physical box)	RLUD	When participants submit the google form, the submission message will contain one arrow with a direction. The combination of all the arrows, in order = directional lock combination.	<ul> <li>Pump/squeeze Directional Lock twice to reset.</li> </ul>
Word Lock (on pencil pouch)	LEAD	<ul> <li>When participants get into the box, they will find a bag full of legos. They need to assemble the legos to reveal a url. That url leads to a jigsaw planet puzzle that they must put together.</li> </ul>	•
Red Herrings	n/a	There are two red herrings in this breakout:  The pink brick in the breakout header.  The help card.	<ul> <li>The pink brick leads to a google search on red herrings.</li> <li>The help cards leads to a gif from Mrs. Doubtfire.</li> </ul>
