

RAPID RESPONSE: SUPER TUESDAY

Super Tuesday is coming up on March 3rd and SRL wants to hear from young people, especially those who are eligible to vote for the first time! Students from ANY state, not just those voting on Tuesday, are encouraged to submit. Student reporters are encouraged to talk to young voters from their schools or wider communities. Please use the following questions to guide each interview for this Rapid Response.

PRIMARY STATES in play: Alabama, Arkansas, California, Colorado, Maine, Massachusetts, Minnesota, North Carolina, Oklahoma, Tennessee, Texas, Utah, Vermont, Virginia (DEM); Convention: Alaska (GOP); Caucus: American Samoa (DEM)

Interview Questions

1. For the record, **please say and spell your full name and say your school and grade.**

Interviewers should explain, "Please restate my questions when you give your answers."

2. Will you be old enough to vote in the 2020 primary elections?
3. Are you planning on voting? If yes, why? If no, why not?
4. Describe what it feels like to vote for the first time.
5. Who are you going to vote for? Why? What issues do you care about?
6. What specifically influenced your decision? (family and friends, social media/TV, ads, candidates' performance in debates, etc.?)
7. What specific obstacles make it difficult for young people to vote in your community? Do you know anyone who will not vote because of these obstacles? If yes, tell us their story.
