As I walked into the library, High tech center 1, and High tech center 2 I learned a lot more than I did from the GCC website. It was truly an amazing experience as well as an eye opener. I did not realize how many helpful resources there are for students and almost half of the time it's free. After doing research in person as well as online I was able to evaluate using few criteria such as the expense/ cost, availability, and effectiveness.

First, for the library also known as the media center is something I am familiar with. I have actually used the library multiple times to do my homework and assignments when I was on my break before my last class. The library talking from personal experience is quite helpful.

Because it was so peaceful there, with enough information to do research and complete a paper either from books or computer research; I was able to focus. It is also open mon-thur seven a.m. to nine p.m. and from noon on Sundays to six p.m. For all the reasons I listed and because I personally got to experience using the library and seeing its effectiveness, this is one of the resources that I would say is the most beneficial. In contrast to the media center, I would say High tech center 2 is great but not as great as the media center. For starters when I did my research online, there was not much information about it that seemed like it was helpful to the students of GCC. What I found online was that basically there is STEM tutoring available from Monday to thursday nine a.m to 6 p.m and sunday only up to one p.m. STEM tutoring seems helpful. Lastly, I would say High tech 1 has little to no benefits compared to the media center and High tech 2. High tech one did not have professors office. It seemed independent. If students just like being independent, and want more personal space then this is great for that, but I do not see any effectiveness or rise in grades if a

student needs help and goes in here and tries to do things on their own. It would be a waste of time. It is open mon-thur 7 a.m to 8 p.m, fri 7 a.m to 6 p.m and sat 8 a.m to 1 p.m.
