Sheet 1: Begins at page 143 in the text with section 108. Answer these questions.

Which warnings are given by Luke's Jesus in 108, and what does he instruct the disciples? What crucial context does he provide in part c?

What is the point of Luke's most famous parable in 116? At what type of person is it aimed?

What is the point of the oft misinterpreted parable (as in Joyce's Grace) in 117a, and does it connect with 117b?

Who is Lazarus, and why is he important? Why (aside from science) is this unlikely to be true?

What is John's reason for the Jews conspiring against Jesus? What's unlikely about this alliance?

In 122, what is Jesus's teaching that Catholics today follow? How does Matthew explain?

What is the connection between 122 and 124a as the specific subject matter is different?

What key difference does Matthew have from Mark and Luke in 124a? Which singer/songwriter echoes this part?

What is the point of Matthew's parable in 124b? How does this connect to Luke's 127a. Is this theme authentic?

Explain the odd Lukan parable at 127b. How does it connect to 127a.?

What occurs on the Sunday before Passover (128b)? How would Jesus's followers be feeling this day?

Can you make out any point from Jesus's animosity to the fig tree in 129a?

What is crucially described in 129b that John had said happened two years earlier? What context does this story miss?

What is the point of the famous parable at the bottom of page 179? How does it connect to Jesus's main ideas?

What is the Jesus's point in his famous reply in 133? Who are the Pharisees here likely replacing?
