Post-Secondary Student Timeline

AUGUST

For all post-secondary accounts, portals, applications, etc... please use a PERSONAL email. It is recommended to create a new email that can be shared with your parent(s)/ guardian(s). This will help with keeping track of any deadlines, missing documents, or follow-up information.

Note: Parent(s)/Guardian(s) be sure not to email admissions reps for your student but rather *encourage* your student to send the email in their own words.

August 1st- Common Application releases application for Fall 2026

Common Application:

- Create a Common App account
 - Begin filling out your demographic information (application) and adding colleges to your Common Application Dashboard.

Explore SCOIR:

Log into your <u>SCOIR</u> Account

Username: School Email

Password: Temporary Password was sent when we made accounts. Please update it to your own personal password if you haven't made an account yet.

- Complete SCOIR profile (demographic information, activities, achievements, etc..)
- Use your SCOIR to explore colleges
- Please refer to this <u>College Admissions Checklist</u> document to get started.
- College Visits through SCOIR:
 - Click on Colleges
 - Under Research Colleges you will see College Visits
 - Click on College Visits
 - You will see a list of all the Virtual College Visits at MHS. Please make sure you register ahead of time.

Essay:

- Begin brainstorming your college essay. *Check out College Essay Tips in the Post-Secondary Resource Guide.*
 - Essay prompts for Common Application 2025-2026 will not be released until August 1st.
 - If colleges do not accept Common Application, please refer to their individual website for their specific college essay prompt (for example RVCC has their own application process)

Entrance Exam Preparation:

- Create a study plan and register for *College Entrance Exams*. See Test Dates/Deadlines below.
 - o SAT:
 - In-school SAT in the Fall (sign up form will be here once it's available)
 - Track your practice through <u>College Board</u>
 - ACT: ACT Academy

**More Colleges/Universities are becoming Test Optional schools (no entrance exam required).

College Exploration:

- Review Post-Secondary Resources below to assist in college exploration process
- Use SCOIR to explore colleges and add to "My College" list.
- Go on <u>Virtual College Tours!</u>

It is suggested to create a college list of 10 schools that you want to apply to for next year. A few things you want to consider when choosing schools: GPA, SAT/ACT Scores, Major, Size, Location, etc...

Determine if the school is a REACH (your gpa and sat/act scores are lower), TARGET (your gpa and sat/act scores match), or SAFETY (your gpa and sat/act scores are higher). This will give you an idea of your chances of acceptance to the school. You definitely want to have at least (2-3) REACH; (4-5) TARGET; (1-2) SAFETY.

Career Exploration:

- Start Career Exploration to determine what major/career pathway you're interested in.
 - Login into SCOIR and complete the YouScience or other career quizzes
 - o NJCAN
- Determine based on your career what type of education you will need.

SEPTEMBER

Common Application:

- o Create a Common App account
- Read over the first-time student guide
- Review Common Application, check your <u>GRAMMAR</u> (spelling, punctuations, capitalization, etc..). Ask someone to look it over for you!
- Continue to build your College List by adding your colleges to the Dashboard (if the college does not appear on the college list then refer to the individual college website).

Essay:

- Complete a first draft of your common application essay. It is highly encouraged to have others read over your essay(s) before submitting it to colleges!
- Check out College Essay Tips in the Post-Secondary Resource list below.

Not all colleges utilize common application. Please be sure to check the college/university website to determine their application process.

SCOIR:

• Connect your SCOIR and Common App accounts (this is a new feature! You should be able to select an option on your home screen to connect the two accounts)

Letters of Recommendation:

- Determine who will ask to write your letters of recommendations.
 - At least (2) Teachers; (1) Other: Coach, Mentor, etc..; Counselor).
- Complete a <u>BRAG SHEET</u> and provide it to your counselor or teachers. This is also on SCOIR.

OCTOBER

FAFSA and the NJ Alternative Application

- Determine if you can fill out the <u>FAFSA</u>
- Alternative Application:
 - Review the alternative application <u>eligibility</u>
 - Complete NJ Dreamers Alternative Financial Aid Application

Determine if the college/university you're applying to also requires you to submit a CSS Profile

College Application Process:

- Attend the College Application Boot Camp with your counselors (in the Fall)
- Prepare to submit your early action applications. Follow the <u>College Application Submission</u>
 Guide.
- Meet or contact college representatives
- Request your letters of recommendations.
- Sign-up for Instant Decision Days
- Begin to finalize your College Essays (send it to teachers)!
- Continue your applications. Be sure to review them all before the deadlines! Request any documents needed from your school. Determine what schools you need to send transcripts to.
- Use weekends to visit Open Houses!

NOVEMBER

November 1st and November 15th are traditional Early Action/Decision deadlines (Check specific policy for each college). Some schools may have a priority deadline for scholarships!

Note: YOU WILL NEED TO COMPLETE THE ENTIRE COLLEGE ADMISSIONS CHECKLIST BY THIS DATE TO APPLY BY THE DEADLINE

- Meet or contact college representatives
- Request your letters of recommendations.
- Sign-up for Instant Decision Days

DECEMBER

December 1st- FAFSA Application Opens. *Find the latest Free Application for Federal Student Aid* (FAFSA®) *news and documents.*

2026-2027 Financial Aid Update!

Financial Aid Process:

Step 1: Create <u>FSA ID</u> for both parent and student (You will use the same FSA ID all four years in college). Write this down and keep it in a safe place. <u>Check out this Video! How to create your FSA ID.</u>

Step 2: Complete <u>2026-27 FAFSA Application</u> - not released until sometime in December, do not complete before the application is released!

To complete the <u>Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA®)</u>, you will need:

- Student Social Security # or Alien Registration Number (if you are not a U.S. citizen)
- Parent Social Security #, if not applicable student will enter 000-00-0000
- Your 2023 federal income tax returns, W-2s, and other records of money earned. (Note: You
 may be able to transfer your federal tax return information into your FAFSA using the IRS Data
 Retrieval Tool.)
- Bank statements and records of investments (if applicable)
- Records of untaxed income (if applicable)
- An FSA ID to sign electronically.

If you are a <u>dependent student</u>, then you will also need most of the above information for your parent(s).

After you complete the FAFSA Application be sure to create a <u>NJ FAMS</u> Account. **Do NOT use your School Email!**

College Application Process:

December 1st- Additional College & Scholarship Deadline (Check specific policy for each college).

*Early Action/Decision applicants will start to hear back from schools.

- Continue your applications. Be sure to review them all before the deadlines! Request any documents needed from your school. Determine what schools you will need to send transcripts.
- Organize the emails you receive from colleges! Most schools will send you login information to create an applicant portal. Be sure to follow the instructions to create the account. Log in to check your status and any materials missing

JANUARY - APRIL

- January 1st and 15th are the traditional regular decision due dates for applications.
- Complete Scholarship Applications to supplement tuition costs (MHS Local Scholarships, Private Scholarships, and School Specific Scholarship Applications)
- Review Financial Aid Packages from separate colleges

MAY

Notify colleges/universities of your decision!
