Reading Activities: Color in squares as you complete the activities.

What letters can you identify in your house? How many can you find? What sound does each letter make?	Draw a picture of each person in your house. Then, write their names with the letters/sounds that you hear.	Build a fort with pillows and blankets. Have a family member read with you in the fort!	Draw a picture of a friend from school. Can you write the letters/sounds that you hear in his/her name?
Go on a Scavenger Hunt. Find things that all begin with the same sound.	Practice tracing letters with different colored crayons to make rainbow letters.	Make a card for someone special using pictures and letters/words.	Would you rather eat carrots or peas? Why? Draw a picture of you eating carrots or peas. When you are finished tell somebody why and have them write it on the paper for you. You can write some of the sounds by yourself.
Say nursery rhymes in a sing/song-like way. Add motions and/or your favorite dance moves to have a dance party!	Pick a favorite recipe or food and help an adult make the dish. While making the recipe, be sure to look for letters that you know.	Have your child collect some things around the house and put them in a container. Have your child select 1 item at a time and tell you what it is. Ask them "What sound do you hear at the beginning of ___?"	Play "Simon Says". Example: Simon Says to find the letter "C", Simon Says to find something that starts the same as "ball". Use different letters of the alphabet.
Write some letters on small pieces of paper. Cut the paper into 2 or 3 pieces. Then put the letter puzzles together.	Cut apart the nursery rhyme cards. Pull a rhyme out each day, say it with your child and have him/her act it out and repeat it with you several times. Review the ones you've practiced each day.	Go on a walk with someone special. Make a list of things that you see. Use the letters/sounds that you hear in your writing.	Ask your child - Who do you miss from school the most? Why? Draw a picture letter for your friend and ask your teacher for the child's address (if it is okay with the other parent).
