## Supplies you will need

- 1 stick free
- Yarn in dark green, light green, white, grey, and black \$17.50 USD each skein is about 3.50 if you get one of the cheaper kinds of yarn.
- Knitting needles around 3-7\$ USD
- Scissors

Difficulty: easy, if you know basic knitting.

## Instructions:


1. First you need to get a stick. Go out into your backyard or into the forest and pick up a good looking stick.



2. Next you'll need the rest of your supplies, which is the yarn and the knitting needles, the scissors come later



3. You want your flag to be proportionate to your stick. I made the mistake of casting on too many stitches so instead of casting on 60 like I did, cast on 30 stitches. After you've cast on keep knitting until you've done 6 rows.



4. Once you've knit 6 rows tie on the next color. Make sure to keep the strings from the ties somewhat long because we will be using these to tie the flag onto the stick. Keep repeating this step until your finished with the last color. While you're knitting make sure to keep all the ties on the same side. Once you cast off make sure you leave the left over string on the side of the ties as well and keep that somewhat long.



5. Once you've finished just tie the extra string around the stick. For the single strands left over I wrapped it around the stick a few times then tied the string to itself. Something else you could do if you cut the string to short or can't figure out how to use one string to tie the ends of the flag to the stick you could cut some string one in green and one in black, string the green one

through the green end and the black one through the black end and tie the ends of those strings together around the stick. There will be some excess string you could leave them be or make more knots it's up to you.



## 6. Now your flag is done.
