1. Course annotation

The volume of the module:	Total number of hours – 90 (lectures - 5 hours, practical classes - 45 hours, individual student work - 40 hours); ECTS credits - 3. According to Educational program Medicine (Specialty – 222 Medicine Field of study – 22. Health) discipline “Medical Law of Ukraine” is combined with discipline “Forensic Medicine”. According to Educational Plan for 2020/2021 years: discipline “Medical Law of Ukraine” consist of: 1 ECTS credit; Total number of hours – 30 (lectures – 2 hours, practical classes - 8 hours, individual student work - 20 hours)
Objective of the Course:	This course provides a broad overview of legal regulation of medical sphere in Ukraine. Aims of this Course are: professional training of medical students in order to create and develop their competence in law in general, and legal regulation of medical sphere, in particular; acquisition of systematic legal knowledge on the regulation of different types of medical activities; gaining skills for informed decision-making to ensure the effective functioning of medical enterprises.

Final control form: Differentiated credit.

Tools for diagnosing learning achievements: Individual tasks, presentations, essay, control questions, tests, situation resolving, final control question.

2. Evaluation.

Evaluation is made in accordance with Regulations on the procedure for assessing students' knowledge during current and final discipline control (Bogomolets NMU Rector's Decree Nu.782, dated 30 September 2019).

Scores, received by students, are divided:

Knowledge of each student is assessed on each practical class. Such assessment is made with standard tools for diagnosing learning achievements: individual tasks, presentations, essay, control questions, tests, situation resolving. Traditional marks "5-4-3-2" are converted into scores according to the following scale:

Traditional mark	Scores	Assessment criteria
"2"	0	59% or less of correct answers
"3"	24-29	60-74% of correct answers
"4"	30-35	75-89% of correct answers
"5"	36-40	90-100% of correct answers

An individual task for students in the form of written work is also subject to evaluation – essay and presentation (from 0 to 40 scores).

The form of final control on discipline "Medical Law of Ukraine" is "Differentiated credit".

Differentiated credit is a form of final control which consists in assessing the student's mastery of the educational material of the discipline on the basis of the results of current education, the implementation of individual and control measures. When setting a grade for the discipline, the number of points accumulated by the student for the current study is taken into account (maximum number of points is 200). Enrollment of the student's discipline is carried out differentiated according to the total number of accumulated points, which must be not less than the minimum required, and correspond to the minimum value of the grade E, and therefore is 111 points.

"Medical Law of Ukraine" discipline is evaluated according to following scale:
