Teaching and Learning Updates NEW

Unit 4 in reading and writing is underway. Kindergarteners are entomologists, learning lots about insects. In grades 1-5 students are applying the research skills they learned in Unit 2 (the informational research unit). In Unit 4 students are constructing opinions supported by text evidence. Each week students do research based on a question and then use that research to answer an argument prompt. Students will rehearse for this writing with partner talk, whole class conversations and debate.

Bike Bonanza 2024!

Old Spokes Home is excited to be hosting our annual Bike Bonanza this year on **Saturday, May 4th, from 2-4pm** at the O'Brien Center in Winooski. The Bike Bonanza is a bike giveaway for children aged 3-8 years old whose families cannot afford or have difficulty affording bicycles. As many as 100+ bikes and helmets will be available on a first come, first served basis. There is no pre-registration required. This event is made possible by the many beloved Old Spokes Home volunteers who put in hours of labor to fix up kids bikes in our Community Workshop and show up to help on the day of the event, and by a number of partner organizations who help us get the word out to families and children who are in the market for a free bicycle.

Drinking water at SA

The State of Vermont requires all schools and child care providers to test their drinking water for lead. Samples of water from every tap at Sustainability Academy that is reasonably expected to be used for drinking or cooking were collected and sent to a certified drinking water lab for analysis.

Results for Sustainability Academy:

All the taps sampled had results BELOW the 4 part per billion (ppb) action level.

No further action is currently necessary. The drinking water can continue to be used.

Lead exposure poses a special risk to children because they absorb lead into their systems more easily than adults do. Lead can slow down growth, impair development and learning, and can cause behavior problems. While the major source of lead poisoning in Vermont children is paint, lead in plumbing pipes and fixtures can add to a person's overall exposure. Drinking water in schools and homes may contain lead from old pipes, plumbing fixtures (such as fountains and faucets), or the solder that joins pipe sections together.
