### **Old or unfinished business**

Sustainability chats: Brittany suggested we find librarians around the state who could speak about something sustainable they have implemented, such as the director in Wolfeboro speaking about the installation of solar. Nancy said NH Saves may be able to do a program, as they have agreed to speak at a conference. Also, Newbury offers DIY kits, and Jenny did a toy swap that was popular. Wednesdays at noon seemed to work well, however, we will be flexible with dates depending on who is speaking on a topic and their schedule.

### **New business**

Concerns: What is the conference committee's budget? Does everyone need to get a bag? Should be thoughtful about giving out swag and the sustainability of that - will everyone want what is given out?

- Whether this committees' recommendations for sustainable vendors and the conference attendee pledge were adopted and what is being done to use these recommendations.
