Laundry Room How To Do Laundry ■ Wash ☐ Gather your dirty laundry. ☐ Don't forget towels (bath towels, hand towels, and dish towels) ☐ Sheets can go here too, if you're up to doing them. ☐ Locate your nearest washing machine. ☐ Make sure you have quarters if you need them! Often laundromats will have machines that will give you change for dollar bills; check with your local laundromat to see what they have. ☐ Read the directions! Do you put detergent in first? Do that now. ☐ For the love of god don't use dishwasher detergent! (ask me how I know...) ☐ If you separate your laundry by lights/darks/whites, do that now. □ Put in your first load. ☐ Add soap if you haven't already. ☐ If you need to add bleach to a compartment before you start the load, do it now. ☐ Do you use fabric softener in a ball or other delivery system? Check the directions to see if you add them now. ☐ Close & start the machine. □ Wait. ☐ Do instructions have you adding softener or bleach mid-cycle? If yes, do it. Wait. ☐ Ding! Washing machine is done! □ Dry ☐ You've got two options here: hang to air dry or stick em in the dryer. ☐ Did you need quarters for the washing machine? Do you have enough for the dryer? Make sure!

☐ Pull the damp clothes out of the washing machine.

Assess each piece of clothing: does it go in the dryer?
☐ Yes? Put it in the dryer.
No? Set it aside to deal with later. Labels will tell you this. You can find a good one at https://www.pinterest.com/pin/314477986460088197/
☐ Optional: throw in a dryer sheet.
Adjust the heat settings on the dryer to where you want them
☐ Check the lint trap and clean it out if the last person didn't do it.
☐ Close & start the machine
☐ Wait
☐ Hang up your air-dry clothing, if possible
☐ Wait some more
☐ Ding! Dryer is done!
Clean the lint trap. Srsly, be nice to the next person after you. Or to future you.
Pull out some clothes & see if they're dry.
No? Start the machine again
☐ Yes? Congrats! Your laundry is ⅔ done. Pull out your dry clothes and
continue on your way!
If you couldn't hang dry your clothes because you were in a laundromat or otherwise not in your own home, do it as soon as you get home
☐ Last step: Fold, hang, and put away your clothes.
☐ Just take it one piece at a time. 10-20 minutes at a time. Take breaks.
☐ I promise you will feel better with your clothes put away.

Office
 Physically clean computer (desktop) Turn your computer off. It's hard sometimes, I know, but it's good for the computer to rest now and then Pull out the tower. If you can do this with the cords connected, that's fine. Just be very careful. If you need to disconnect the cords, see below. Wipe off collected dust and pet hair. You can do this with your hands or a damp (not dripping or even very wet, just damp) cloth. Optional: Clean out the inside Disconnect all the cords. Remember what goes where! This will be important later. I trust most of you know what goes where, but if you don't, you can wrap a piece of masking tape around the cord and write on the tape what the cord is & where it goes. Or write it down in a notebook. Pull the tower out completely.
Lie it down on a flat surface, with the removable side facing up.

		Unscrew the side.			
		Put the screws somewhere safe! An empty cup or bowl is a good idea.			
		Remove the side that's now free of screws.
