## Project description

<b>Name of the project</b>	<b>English Together</b>
<b>Short description</b>	Our project, ENGLISH TOGETHER, focuses on developing grammar, vocabulary, and pronunciation skills. Pupils take on the role of creators, producing both linguistic and functional content. Working in international teams, they design games and activities, enhance their grammar, and expand their vocabulary.

<b>Aims</b>	<p><b>Main aim:</b> to create useful output using students' own language and pragmatically exploit their language skills and experience</p> <p><b>Specific aims:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Increase students' motivation and interest in learning English through the creation and playing of cooperative board and card games.</li> <li>● Develop students' grammar, vocabulary, and pronunciation skills in English at the B1 level.</li> <li>● Encourage creativity, teamwork, and collaboration, as well as critical thinking among students. Improve intercultural understanding and tolerance among students from different countries.</li> <li>● Use information and communication technologies to support language learning and collaboration.</li> </ul>
<b>Work process</b>	<p>Students will work in mixed groups, with each student being assigned a specific task to complete within their group. Some tasks will be designed to involve all partners collaboratively.</p> <p>Each month, a challenge will be issued to create content that practices a specific grammar point in English (e.g., present simple/continuous, past simple/continuous, present perfect vs. past simple, future tenses, etc.).</p> <p>Throughout the year, we will also organise online meetings where pupils can play various games they have created themselves, allowing them to improve their skills and test the quality of the content they have developed.</p>
