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SCHOOL AND COMMUNITY

Enterprise High School is a four year comprehensive public high school in the Shasta Union High School District, serving students grades nine through twelve. Enterprise offers a well-rounded educational program to students on the east side of the Sacramento River in Redding, California. Redding is a rural town located two and half hours north of Sacramento, California. Major employers include Mercy Medical Center, Shasta County Government, City of Redding City Government, Shasta Regional Medical Center and Shasta College. Enterprise is a California Distinguished School and is accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC).

CURRICULUM INFORMATION

Enterprise High School has a broad range of course offerings in the core content areas, and a wide variety of elective courses. Courses are available in English, math, science, social studies, languages other than English, visual arts, performing arts, computer science, engineering, business, applied technology, physical education, career and technical education and academic support. Students have open access to Honors and Advanced Placement courses. Underclassmen are encouraged to enroll in six courses and seniors must enroll in a minimum of four. All classes at Enterprise High School are heterogeneously grouped.

Enterprise operates on an academic semester calendar with six periods in a day. Students earn 5 credits per course per semester. To graduate, students must earn 230 credits in designated subject areas. To earn credits in courses required for graduation, students must demonstrate proficiency in the graduation and subject content standards associated with the course.

There are a variety of opportunities available for students to take college classes at the nearby community college, Shasta College. College Connection is a program where seniors can apply to spend their senior year at Shasta Community College. Dual Enrollment courses enable students to earn high school and college credits simultaneously while taking pre-approved courses at Enterprise. Concurrent Enrollment enables Enterprise students to take college courses at Shasta College on campus or online.

Critical Thinking: students analyze and synthesize a range of sources to evaluate complex issues and ideas in order to solve problems

CLASS RANK

Class Rank is determined by decile groups of ten percent within a students' class. Weighted academic grades are used to determine decile class rank. Students are officially ranked by decile at the end of each semester beginning in their 9th grade year. For example, with a senior class of 300 students the first decile includes, approximately, the top 30 students' GPA. The second decile would contain the next ten percent of student GPAs and so forth.
