The Alexander Rutherford Scholarship

Named in honour of Alexander Rutherford, Alberta's first Premier and Minister of Education, this scholarship recognizes and rewards exceptional academic achievement at the senior high school level and for students planning to pursue full-time post secondary studies.

Any student who is an Alberta resident with an average of 75% or higher in five designated courses qualifies for an award. The scholarship has a maximum value of \$2,500 and is based on scholastic achievement in Grades 10, 11 and 12. The Alexander Rutherford Scholarship can be applied to entrance at many post secondary institutions world-wide.

Apply by May 1st for post secondary studies starting in September. Apply by December 1st for post secondary studies starting in January.

Please note that if a student has earned credit for a course based on retroactive credits the mark on the Alberta transcript will be noted as a "pass." The Gilman Cardinal Scholarship for Indigenous Education

The Gilman Cardinal Scholarship has been established to honour the memory and legacy of Elder Gilman Cardinal, who played a pivotal role in supporting Indigenous Education for all students, families, and staff at Ignite Centre for eLearning. This scholarship will be awarded to any Ignite Centre for eLearning High School student who has a demonstrated history of commitment to the values, knowledge, and culture of Indigenous peoples through education.

Easter Seals Scholarships

Norman Denoon Memorial Scholarship - Established in memory of Norman Denoon, the Easter Seals Alberta Norman Denoon Memorial Scholarship offers post-secondary academic scholarships to students living with disabilities that have made a significant contribution through volunteerism or advocacy.

Two scholarships of \$5,000 per school year are given to qualified students working towards a post-secondary program within Alberta.

<u>Workplace Readiness Mentorship Program Scholarship:</u> The Workplace Readiness Mentorship Program, funded by Sun Life, will provide a **\$2,000 scholarship** to a student in Alberta who are entering or currently enrolled in a post-secondary institution and match them with a volunteer mentor who will provide guidance and assist them in preparing for the workplace.

Candidates will be given consideration based on the following criteria:

- A resident of Alberta.
- Have a disability,
- Currently attending or will be attending post-secondary education within Alberta (college, university, vocational/trades program).

Accessible Technology and Mentorship Program Scholarship

Easter Seals is pleased to partner with Scotia Bank, through its ScotiaRISE commitment, to offer financial grants and mentorship opportunities to students in Alberta who are currently in or who will be entering high school in Fall 2024.

The grants are valued at \$1000 per student. Students can apply the grant funding toward purchasing laptops, learning aids or other specialized/adaptive learning equipment, learning software, or tutoring and other costs required for school.

The grant and mentorship opportunity is intended for any student with a disability who is currently enrolled in or entering high school in Fall 2024. The scholarship's objective is to reduce financial barriers for the students as they complete high school and assist them in preparing for a successful transition into post-secondary education or entry into the workforce.

As part of this unique opportunity, recipients can participate in a year-long mentorship program from September 2024 to June 2025. The recipients will be paired with a volunteer mentor who can provide encouragement, guidance, and support for their future studies or work experience.
