NO EXCEPTIONS WILL BE ALLOWED

RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. The SRCYLS General Rules & Regulations apply to this show.
2. All swine must be owned or leased by December 30, 2025.
3. "Market Class" swine are exempt from the OCVI and test requirements, provided that all swine in the class go directly to slaughter following the exhibition.
4. All hogs entered in the Market Swine Show and accepted by the Livestock Committee must be consigned to the sale and must be processed for consumption or sent to resale.

5. Each exhibitor assumes all liability in case of death or injury to his or her hog until sold, at which time the purchaser assumes the liability.
6. All swine show exhibitors must attend the mandatory registration, tagging date and initial weigh in. A parent or guardian must also be present at this meeting. Registration and payment **must** be made on this day.
7. Entries are limited to one (1) per student, Club or Chapter. A second animal can be weighed in, but only one can be shown.
8. All exhibitors are required to take part in Swine Showmanship with their own hog (or their club or chapter hog), unless excused by the Swine Committee. Without prior, written, approval, failure to participate will result in the disqualification of the exhibitor and hog from the show and sale.
9. The Swine Committee reserves the right to review any entries; and may, by a majority vote, excuse any hog from entry in the Swine Show and/or Sale, if it is determined to be in the best interest of the Show and Sale.
10. Any decision made by the Livestock Committee or its designee concerning these rules shall be conclusive.
11. The Livestock Committee reserves the right to review any entries and may excuse any swine or exhibitor due to misconduct from entry in the swine show, if it is determined to be in the best interest of the overall show.

SANTA ROSA COUNTY FAIR RECORD BOOKS

Students are responsible for completing an animal record book. Record book templates can be found on [HERE](#). If utilizing a record book for a different show, this must be approved prior to the show. Official 4-H Record books and GCA/NRYO Record Books are acceptable.

Record books must be signed off on by the Superintendent at the final weigh-in. The completed record book is due at the Santa Rosa County Extension Office located at 6263 Dogwood Drive, Milton, FL 32570, by close of business on **Tuesday, April 14, 2026.**

All market animals are required to have a record book. The record book must be presented to the superintendent at the time of final check-in to be signed. After the show and sale is completed, all record books are to be turned in to the Santa Rosa County 4-H Extension office by April 14, 2026.

No checks will be issued without a completed record book. No exceptions will be made.

TAGGING and WEIGHING

All hogs will be weighed and tagged at date and location listed above.

After tagging day, all hogs are the responsibility of the exhibitor.

It is recommended that all hogs weigh between 70 and 90 pounds at initial weigh-in.

Changes of exhibitors, clubs, chapters, and/or animals will not be allowed once they are tagged, unless approved by the SRCY Livestock Committee.

All male hogs entered in the show must be castrated and healed by the initial tagging.

ONLY Barrows and Gilts will be tagged.

SHOW DAY

All hogs must be delivered to the fair grounds on the final weigh-in date listed above.
No animal will be permitted to be re-weighed.

Exhibitors will be responsible for providing any shavings that he or she wants in their area.

At the conclusion of each show and sale, each exhibitor must remove all shavings from the stall and place them in the designated area upon departure. If your stall is red-tagged for any items left behind (equipment, tools, stall tags, trash, etc.) you will be fined \$25.00. The 4-H/FFA advisors are accountable for this determination.

SWINE SHOW AND SALE

Unloading animals is the responsibility of the exhibitor.

YOU MUST REMAIN WITH YOUR ANIMAL THROUGHOUT THE WEIGH-IN PROCESS.

All animals must be clean and free of mud. The swine committee requires ear tags to be clean and easily readable.

- All hogs must weigh 200 pounds or more at final weigh-in. Any hog weighing less than 200 pounds will not show in class but may be allowed to show in showmanship classes. They may sell at auction, but will be charged a 6% commission
- There is NO MAXIMUM weight; however, exhibitor will only be paid up to 300 pounds.
- In the event that there are a large number of hogs in the show, there may be 2 hogs in a stall.
- It is mandatory that all hogs be fed by 7:00 am on the morning of the show.
- If your hog dies while on the fairgrounds, the Show Committee must be contacted immediately.
- All hogs are expected to be clean and ready for the show. They may be washed in designated areas only – not in stalls.
- Clipping is allowed; minimum ½” guard on body.
- No baby powder, oils, show sheen or conditioners may be used on day of show and sale.
- Exhibitors must provide food and containers for their animals. Stalls are equipped with automatic waterers.
- Classes will be divided by weight after all animals have been weighed in.

AUCTION

If you are not prepared to go into the arena with your animal at your assigned time, you will be placed at the end of the line and your hog will be sold last.
