Sign-in sheets were available to establish records of sign in and membership.

6:27 p.m. - Ms. Pasko motioned for the start of the meeting. Becky Lego first and Cecilia Gutierrez second.

Meeting notes from November 2025 were made available, and were asked to be reviewed. No corrections were made. Motion to approve. Ms. Richards first and Ms. Contreras second.

The next topic was public comments—a reminder of the 2-minute limit to make comments with no discussion. No comments noted.

Co-chair Mr. Wilkinson introduced the purpose of tonight's training topic - Citizens Review on Public Comments. In the presentation a slide shared the expectations that this would be at the start of the meeting with a 2 minute limitation and no time for discussion.. No questions were brought up. Moved to the next point of business by Ms. De Leon.

Ms. De Leon shared the discussion of academy changes for the upcoming year. New Tech Academy will be integrated into AHA and STEM. The structure of CTE pathways such as Newspaper and Yearbook had previously been under Arts and Humanities Academy.. Computer Science and Cyber Security fit under the STEM academy. Some pathways (Photography and Film) numbers were low and will not continue. These positions/teachers have/will be able to teach in areas of need (example Ms. Alaniz who handled photography is certified to teach Art).

Ms. De Leon shared the TAPR (Texas Academic Performance Report)- this report had student data on the EOC course from 2024 & 2025. Data showed scores for Approaches, Meets, and Masters Grade level with breakdown of State, District, Campus as well as ethnic demographics and socioeconomic demographics. Discussions show that gaps were visible in subject matter, primarily Algebra I EOC. Parents noted that the testing window and timeframe impacts student success. Freshmen take 3 EOCs and Algebra I is the last one. Discussion about changes to EOC testing under state law may provide better performance with the different tests throughout the year.

Ms. Pasko noted that there were no questions and the meeting ended at 6:58 p.m.
