Lesson Title

Singer/Songwriter Series: Singing, Songwriting, and Harmony

Duration

1hour

Lesson Plan

- 1. Introduction (5 minutes)
- Welcome and Introduction to the Singer/Songwriter Series.
- Brief overview of what singing, songwriting, and harmony entail.
- 2. Warm-Up Exercise (10 minutes)
- Begin with vocal warm-ups to prepare the voice for singing.
- Practice breathing exercises to enhance vocal control.
- 3. Singing Fundamentals (10 minutes)
- Discuss the basics of singing: pitch, tone, and rhythm.

- Sing a simple song together to apply these concepts.
- 4. Introduction to Songwriting (15 minutes)
- Briefly explain the process of songwriting: brainstorming, lyrics, and melody.
- Group activity: brainstorm ideas for a song topic.
- Develop a chorus together as a class.
- 5. Exploring Harmony (15 minutes)
- Define harmony and its role in music.
- Group exercise: split into small groups and practice singing a simple harmony with a familiar tune.
- 6. Wrap-Up and Sharing (5 minutes)
- Recap what was learned during the session.
- Invite volunteers to share their songwriting ideas or harmony attempts.

Materials List

- Whiteboard and markers
- Copies of song lyrics (simple song for group singing)
- Musical instruments (optional, such as keyboard or guitar)
- Paper and pencils for songwriting exercise

Adaptations for Different Ages

- Younger children: Focus more on singing simple songs and basic rhythm exercises. Simplify the songwriting process to include drawing or storytelling.
- Older children: Encourage more complex songwriting techniques and the addition of musical instruments for harmony practice.

Movement Break

- "Silly Sing-Along": Incorporate a movement break by singing a fun, high-energy song and encouraging playful movements like dancing or clapping to the rhythm.

Bonus Activities

- Create a class songbook: Have each student contribute a short song or verse by the end of the series.

- Harmony Challenge: Pair students and have them create harmonies for short sections of popular songs.
- Record a Class Song: Use a smartphone or tablet to record the class's original song created during the session. Share the recording with parents.

- Vocal warm-up exercises and breathing techniques
- Introduction to different music genres and styles
- Listening session with examples of famous singers and their distinctive styles
- 2. **Week 2: Discovering Your Voice**
- Identifying vocal types: soprano, alto, tenor, bass
- Experimenting with vocal ranges and pitches
- Group activity: Encourage students to sing lines from different songs
- 3. **Week 3: Basics of Songwriting**
- Structure of a song: verse, chorus, bridge
- Brainstorming session: Creating simple lyrics based on a theme
- Introduction to rhyme schemes and rhythmic patterns
- 4. **Week 4: Understanding Melody**
- Exploring pitch: Highs and lows in songs
- Creating simple melodies with handheld instruments (e.g., xylophone, recorder)
- Melodic interpretation: Discuss how melodies convey emotion
- 5. **Week 5: Rhythm and Beat**
- Different time signatures and their impacts on music
- Hands-on activity: Experimenting with percussion instruments
- Creating rhythmic patterns for a group jam session
- 6. **Week 6: Harmony and Vocal Layers**
- Introduction to harmony and its role in music
- Singing in rounds and canons with familiar songs
- Group activity: Students create a simple harmony to accompany a melody

- 7. **Week 7: Lyrics and Storytelling**
- Elements of storytelling through song
- Workshop: Transform a short story into song lyrics
- Analyzing popular songs for their lyrical content
- 8. **Week 8: Performance Techniques**
- Stage presence and overcoming performance anxiety
- Microphone techniques and vocal projection
- Mock performance: Students perform a short piece for the class
- 9. **Week 9: Recording and Production Basics**
- Introduction to recording equipment and software
- Hands-on activity: Record a simple song or vocals
- Collaborative project: Students work in pairs to produce a short song
- 10. **Week 10: Showcase and Reflection**
 - Final performance: Students present their original songs
 - Reflection session: Discuss what they have learned and enjoyed
- Certificate ceremony: Recognize students' achievements and encourage future exploration in music
