# Peninsula School District Parent Council Wednesday, April 2, 2025 10:00am-12:00pm

#### I. Attendees

# II. District Update

- Jake Voss, Director of Strategic Communications, discussed the topic of parent organization communication avenues via a phone call with Beth LaTendresse because he could not attend the meeting. This topic was brought up by school representatives at previous meetings and Jake has been looking into it.
- Jake Voss would like to form a committee from school representatives or PTA/VPO board members to provide data and feedback in the creation of a communications guideline that would standardize how parent organizations communicate via school platforms like parent square.
- Several PDC representatives are interested in participating in this. An email list will be provided to Jake Voss.

# III. Katie Russell, Pioneer VPO: Creation of District Wide Elementary STEAM Nights

- Several elementary schools hold STEAM nights for families and students, but not all of our elementary schools are able to do this.
- Multiple schools hosting STEAM nights puts strain on community resources for these
  events. The organizations that donate time or materials or set up tables at STEAM events
  are being requested for multiple events each school year and cannot attend them all.
  Additionally, some activities are costly for PTA/VPO to provide and not all schools have the
  same level of PTA/VPO funds.
- STEAM nights require significant manpower from STEAM Teachers and parent volunteers.
- Pioneer has prepared a proposal to shift the structure of STEAM nights to a district wide event rather than an individual school event. Elementary schools that feed into Peninsula High School would have a joint STEAM event at PHS. Elementary schools that feed into Gig Harbor High School would have a joint STEAM event at GHS. These STEAM events would take place during the day (10 AM to 5 PM) on a Saturday. They would not take place on the same Saturday.
- STEAM teachers would plan and participate jointly.
- This model would provide more experiences for all elementary students. PTA/VPOs would be able to reach out to vendors early and anticipate having more success with vendors and community groups in asking them to attend two events versus several schools trying to schedule their time. PTA/VPOs from each school would contribute by funding experiences and/or providing volunteers. Pioneer is willing to put their current entire STEAM night budget towards the joint event.

- Ideally high school clubs such as the STEAM, Robotics, Astronomy, NHS groups would hopefully be involved to help with setting up and showcase some of the work that they are doing at the high school.
- Katie is looking for feedback on the proposal from PDC school reps and PTA/VPO boards. The proposal will be shared with representatives via a google doc allowing comments.
- Feedback during the meeting from all school representatives in attendance is positive.
   Representatives like the idea of working together to provide a higher level of experience for everyone rather than each school putting in the same amount of effort for their own programs.
- ACTION ITEM: PDC representatives share proposal with your PTA/VPO and review and provide comments to the proposal.

# IV. James Cantonwine, Director of Research and Assessment: Peninsula Parent Partner

- Peninsula Parent Partner is an AI homework tool developed with the goal of providing support to parents wanting to help their children with homework. It is run through ChaptGPT. It differentiates from simply using ChaptGPT because it is optimized to provide answers or give prompts from a tutor perspective. It is directed to parents or tutors rather than students.
- Currently Peninsula Parent Partner is a demo model. The plan is to evaluate if there is parent interest in the application through some targeted use of the demo version.
- The demo is drawing from general information at this point. A fully developed program would have the specific curriculum for PSD courses in its knowledge base and would draw from district specific curriculum for answers.
- The demo is not recording any information.
- <u>Peninsula Parent Partner</u> This link will take you to the demo version. You will need to utilize ChatGPT to access it, but it can be fully used on the free version.
- If development of this program moved forward, the district would likely set it to collect data on subjects being searched so that the district could analyze and use that information in regards to courses and instruction.
- The cost of the program would be minimal.

## Gig Harbor Library - Kayla Ferguson

#### Artondale

- Artondale supports local restaurants that provide dine out fundraisers by utilizing them for conference meals.
- Book fair yielded \$8500 in sales. It was a successful volunteer opportunity.
- Recess Runners started March 24th and runs until May 16th. This program gives kids a purpose at recess and is great for kids who might be struggling to find a place they belong at recess. Shoe tokens are handed out for every 10 laps. This program is run completely by parent volunteers. It is a popular volunteer event and sign up fills quickly.
- Health room is in need of boys pants sizes 6-12.
- April 8th carpool to school day! STEAM teachers encourage carpooling or riding the bus.
- April 23rd is plastic free lunch day.
- May 8th Milleville Pizza takeover all day.
- June 9th career day.

### **Discovery**

- Read & Lead Explorers far surpassed their 300,000 school-wide goal and reached 407,306 minutes. We're doing a popcorn party for the school on Friday. There has been great feedback from parents that students built new reading habits.
- Spring Family Night on March 18 with performer Alex Zerbe was a success. I highly recommend this performer! We also had Makers Market, Spring Book Fair, book bus, Pierce County Library, and a free book swap table (thank you Karmen for your generous donations!). Book Fair total for the week: \$3400.
- Update on Gaga Ball Pit. We are waiting to hear if the PSD Board has approved our \$5,000 donation to the school for recess equipment that we donated back in Fall 2023. Part of the \$5,000 we gave the school is intended to be used for a Gaga Ball Pit and storage sheds for recess equipment. We have told the community this is coming just need final approval.
- VPO has received district approval for our funding to install a water refill station (\$2300). And the first water refill station that Discovery received from a grant from Pierce County is arriving on April 3rd. We expect installation for both fountains will happen this spring.
- Girls on the Run is underway. Let me Run we have 8 boys registered so far. We will be asking GHHS service organizations and track/field to be junior coaches too.
- Staff Conference Meal VPO funded a Chick-fil-A lunch on March 20. The staff LOVED it.
- Color Run Fundraiser will kick off April 24. This year, we are leaning toward giving all students a free t-shirt, with students who set up their 99 Pledges site being able to request a t-shirt size. This year, I am leading Color Run, next year we are excited about having an outside firm help us.

• The same 3-4 (and I mean 3-4) parents are doing all of the above and more. Our VPO Board at Discovery will have 3 vacant positions for next year, only 2 members are staying on. We will be actively recruiting while also cutting a lot of the extras our VPO has traditionally done for next year.
