

# Academic and Behavior Policy

A student placed in the ACE program must maintain academic and behavioral excellence. This student must show school work and evaluations that coincide with his or her gifted and talented status. In addition, he or she must be a model citizen as well. All students will be able to look up to a gifted and talented student in Cedar Grove as a model student. However, all students make mistakes or poor choices, so it is our role together to guide each gifted and talented child.

When an identified student displays behavior or coursework difficulties the following procedure will be executed:

First Violation-verbal warning: The gifted and talented teacher will speak with the student one-on-one. The teacher will establish what behavior/situation is undesirable and ask the student to correct it.

Second Violation-parent contacted: A phone call, email, or both will be made to/for the student's parent. The gifted and talented teacher will ask the parent to discuss the behavior/situation(s) with their child and plans ways in which they can rectify the problem.

Third Violation-Meeting: A meeting will be held with the parent(s), student, teacher, and principal. In this meeting, all will work together to find a solution that will ensure the student's success in the classroom.

Final Violation: If the situation continues beyond this point, removal from the program may occur based on the recommendation of a district administrator.

## Attendance Policy

Students need to be responsible and remember their ACE day. In addition, attendance is more than being in class; it is coming to class prepared and ready to work. If this requirement is not met, the student will be informed and an appropriate consequence will be given. If it is a repeat occurrence, the parents/guardian will be notified.
