Indent first line of paragraph (0.5 cm), set margins of document to A4 with margins set to: 3 cm top, 3 cm bottom, 2 cm left, 2 cm right. Recall that abstracts should not exceed 300 words (excluding title, author names, affiliations and references).

Start new paragraphs like this (no extra spacing before or after). If you wish to include a figure or a table, center the caption if it is one line and justify it if the caption is longer than one line. Captions should be inserted below figures and before tables.

Send an MS Word and a PDF version of your abstract. Files must not be password protected. To name your files use the last name of the first author and the first two words of the title, e.g., “Carlet _Phonetic training.docx,” “Carlet _Phonetic training.pdf.”

References must conform to the latest [APA Manual of Style](#) and should be listed in alphabetical order. References and acknowledgements are placed after the abstract text separated by one empty line. Use 10 pt Times New Roman and indent second line and following (0.5 cm) for each reference, as illustrated below:
