#### Overview

The Distance Education Advisory Committee (DEAC) has outlined recommendations for online teaching. These support both existing faculty members and new hires teaching in any DE modality (synchronous online, asynchronous online, hybrid and multi-modal). We have outlined recommendations for online teaching certification, recertification and certification equivalency.

These recommendations are fluent and meant to be used as a basic guide. They may need to be adapted in a discipline-specific way, and based on unique division needs.

### **Recommendations for Faculty Online Teaching Qualifications**

### **Online Teaching Certification**

We recommend that faculty who are interested in teaching online courses have a current online teaching certification that was completed in the last three years. This training should include:

- Course design with Canvas LMS
- Accessibility standards for online courses
- Online Teaching Pedagogy with emphasis on online engagement and interaction
- Modality-specific training

Approved Online Teaching Certification Programs (as of Spring 2024):

- SMCCCD QOTL 1
- @One Online Teaching & Design Certificate
- Equivalent Online Certificates from other CC districts (requires syllabus and time commitment review)

## **Online Teaching Re-Certification**

We recommend that online teaching certification be renewed every 3 years. Re-certification can be achieved in a number of ways, including:

- SMCCCD QOTL 2
- POCR Reviewer Certification
- Converting a course to ZTC or OER
- Accessibility Training
- @One Courses:
  - o 1 Self-Paced & 1 Facilitated
  - o 2 Facilitated
- Existing Course Review (1-on-1 with instructional designer)

#### **Certification Equivalency**

If you've completed an online teaching certification course not listed above, you can apply for equivalency by filling out the <u>DE Faculty Teaching & Training Questionnaire</u>. Please include your certification of completion, and respond to all questions in as much detail as possible.

# **Priority Sequence**

- 1. Subject matter expertise
  - Good candidates are hard to find (especially in certain areas and willing to teach for several semesters)
- 2. Online teaching training (course design and pedagogy)
  - Connect with Cañada OTL team
  - Meet candidates where they are
  - Create custom path for online teaching training
- 3. Become fully certified within a grace period of one semester

## Options for new hires during the first semester

- 1. No online teaching experience
  - Use existing Canvas course & Team Teach
  - Teach an in-person course
- 2. Limited or dated online teaching experience
  - Teach the course as long as
    - o experience with Canvas
    - o extensive division support is available

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#### **Online/Hybrid Course Assignment Process**
