Members of Datacure adhere to the following values:

- Confidentiality of communications In providing a safe space to share
 information and discuss issues in a frank and honest manner, we recognize the
 need to keep the specific content of our listserv postings, discussions and
 other communications to group members only. We adhere to "vegas rules" what happens in datacure, stays in datacure. Sharing the substance of

- datacure discussions in aggregate and anonymously is usually acceptable, unless a member explicitly asks the group not to share at all.
- Respect In order to foster a positive environment where everyone feels that their contributions are welcome, we conduct all of our interactions with courtesy, civility and an appreciation for what each of us bring to the group.
