# 1. Charlie Painter, Beavercreek High School (Coach Inductee-2000)

- Founder of MVTCA, served as president for 10 years.
- Has coached high school tennis at Carroll, Franklin, Bishop Fenwick, Oakwood, Beavercreek, Wando (SC), and Archbishop Alter; 15 conference championships.
- Coached at Wright State for 10 years, first in career wins at 150.
- Coaching record is 846-369
- OHSAA Sportsmanship, Ethics, and Integrity Award 2013-14; OHSAA state tournament official; OTCA executive board member; 2011 USPTA Midwest High School Coach of the Year; OTCA Hall of Fame member, South Carolina Region 7 Coach of the Year 2021 and 2022. South Carolina 5A State Runner up in 2021 and 2022.

# 2. Tim Voegeli, Kettering Fairmont High School (Coach Inductee-2000)

- First winner of the OHSAA Sportsmanship, Ethics, and Integrity Award Long time district tournament director and state tournament official; Head state rules interpreter.
- One of the founders of MVTCA.
- Member of the Ohio Tennis Coaches' Association Hall of Fame and longtime member of the OTCA Executive Board.

#### 3. Vin Romeo, Miami Valley School High School (Coach Inductee-2000)

- Coached for 86 seasons (boys and girls) and had a record of 1366-282 Most wins in Ohio; ranks fourth nationally in career wins.
- Longtime Southwest district representative to OTCA and member of OTCA Hall of Fame One of the founders of MVTCA.

#### 4. Sharon Paul, Milton Union High School (Coach Inductee-2001)

- Retired as the girls' coach after 38 years with a record of 509-159.
- Served as president of the Ohio Tennis Coaches' Association in 1998 and 1999 Won 13 league titles and coached 15 doubles teams to state with four 4th place finishes Inducted into OTCA Hall of Fame in 2003 and received OHSAA SEI Award in 2001; was MVTCA Coach of the Year three times and President's award winner three times.

#### 5. Pippy Booth, Lehman Catholic High School (Coach Inductee-2001)

- Coached girls' tennis for 20 years and boys' tennis for 17 years; record of 321-253 Won 7 league titles for girls and 2 league titles for boys; Coached 1 boys' doubles team to state.
- Won OHSAA SEI Award in 2006; MVTCA Coach of the Year 2 times; President's Award once.
- Served as President of MVTCA for 16 years.

## 6. Don Gillespie, Northmont High School (Coach Inductee-2004)

- Coached one state championship doubles team.

# 8. Mark Goldner, Troy High School (Coach Inductee-2007)

#### 10. Scott Long, Centerville High School (Coach Inductee-2013)

- Coached at Wayne, Carlisle, and Centerville for 24 years with a record of 687-190 - 24 SWBL, WOL, and/or GWOK Conference Championships, 4 Runners-ups - Coached 17 State Qualifiers and 21 players have moved on to college tennis - Served OTCA as district representative, vice-president, president and current treasurer; Served MVTCA as vice-president and president for 13 years.

# 11. Jim Brooks, Chaminade Julienne High School (Coach Inductee-2013)

- Has coached at Chaminade Julienne for 24 years; 14 state qualifiers.
- Inducted into the CJ Hall of Fame in 2013 and the OTCA Hall of Fame in 2018 Received the OHSAA SEI Award in 2012.

#### 12. Marianna Wright, Brookville High School (Coach Inductee-2014)

# 19. Kim Gilbert, Oakwood High School (Coach Inductee-2020)

- Member of University of Michigan Hall of Fame, Cincinnati Hall of Fame, and the NCAA Tennis Hall of Fame.

# 10. Kristi Spangenberg-Henn, Centerville High School (Player Inductee-2012)

- Won state doubles titles in 1978 and 1979.
- Played collegiate tennis at Eastern Kentucky University.
- In senior year, was chosen EKU Intercollegiate Athletics Sportswoman of the Year Inducted into the Centerville High School Athletic Hall of Fame in 2006.

# 11. Annie Plessinger-Hartley, Springboro High School (Player Inductee-2012)

- 1997 team won Big 10 and Regional; Qualified for NCAA Tournament as a team with team ranking of #16.

# 15. Alyssa Ritchie, Waynesville High School (Player Inductee-2014)

- Won state singles titles in 2009 and 2010.

- Ranked #1 in Ohio Valley, #11 in Midwest, and #94 nationally.
- Played collegiate tennis for University of North Carolina Wilmington.
- Received Rookie of the Year, Team Catalyst Award, and Team Leadership Award; All league honors in both singles and doubles; NCAA All Academic Team.
