

Amos' Prophecies

Amos 5:24

QUESTIONS

AGES 3–5

1. Who was Amos? *A prophet who delivered God's message.*
2. Did God want His people to obey Him? *Yes.*
3. Was God pleased when people worshiped Him but disobeyed Him? *No.*
4. What does God want His people to do? *Love Him and do what is right.*

AGES 6–8

1. What job did Amos have before becoming a prophet? *He was a shepherd and cared for sycamore trees.*
2. Why did God send Amos to Israel? *To warn the people about their sin.*
3. What kinds of sins did Amos condemn? *Injustice, dishonesty, and neglecting God's commands.*
4. What did Amos tell the people to do? *Seek the LORD and live.*

AGES 9–11

1. Why was Amos' message surprising to many people? *Israel was prosperous, yet God declared that their hearts were far from Him.*
2. What does Amos teach about true worship? *True worship includes obedience, justice, and righteousness.*
3. Why did God judge Israel through Amos' prophecy? *Because of their persistent sin, hypocrisy, and mistreatment of others.*
4. What hope did Amos offer after announcing judgment? *God would ultimately restore His people according to His promises.*

INTRODUCE

AGES 3–5

DOING WHAT IS RIGHT

Ask the children if they know the difference between right and wrong. Give simple examples such as sharing toys, obeying parents, and telling the truth. Explain that Amos taught people that God wants us to do what is right.

CLEAN ON THE OUTSIDE

Show two cups, one clean and one dirty on the inside. Ask the children if it is important for something to be truly clean. Explain that God cares not only about what people do on the outside but also about what is in their hearts.

AGES 6–8

FAIR OR UNFAIR?

Present a few simple situations and ask whether they are fair or unfair. Discuss why fairness matters. Explain that Amos spoke against people who treated others unfairly and ignored God's commands.

HEARING A WARNING

Ask students why warning signs exist. Discuss how warnings help keep people safe. Explain that Amos delivered God's warning so the people could turn back to Him before judgment came.

AGES 9–11

LOOKING GOOD ON THE OUTSIDE

Ask students if someone can appear good on the outside while hiding problems on the inside. Discuss how appearances can be misleading. Explain that Amos challenged people whose worship looked impressive but whose hearts were far from God.

WHAT IS TRUE WORSHIP?

Ask students what worship means and write several answers on the board. Explain that Amos taught that true worship involves loving God, obeying Him, and treating others according to His standards.

ILLUSTRATE

AGES 3–5

STRAIGHT OR CROOKED?

Materials:

A straight ruler and a bent or curved object

Directions:

Show the ruler and the curved object. Explain that God wants people to follow His ways, which are right and true. Amos told God's people they had wandered away from God's path and needed to return to Him.

HELPING OTHERS

Materials:

Pictures showing children helping, sharing, and being kind

Directions:

Show the pictures and ask what the children are doing. Explain that God wants His people to love Him and treat others with kindness and fairness.

OBEY GOD FROM YOUR HEART

Ask the children to name one way they can obey God this week. Pray together and ask God to help them love Him and do what is right.

AGES 6–8

JUSTICE FLOWS

Materials:

Clear pitcher of water and large bowl

Directions:

Slowly pour water into the bowl while reading Amos 5:24: "Let justice roll down like waters." Explain that God wants righteousness and justice to flow continually through the lives of His people, not just occasional acts of obedience. Demonstrate this by pouring at different speeds, going from drops at a time to a steady stream.

SEEK THE LORD

Ask students to think about one area where they need to obey God more faithfully. Encourage them to pray and ask God for help. Remind them that Amos called people to seek the LORD and live.

AGES 9–11

THE FRUIT TEST

Materials:

One good piece of fruit and one spoiled piece of fruit

Directions:

Show both fruits and compare them. Explain that outward appearances can sometimes hide problems inside. Discuss how Amos challenged Israel because their religious activities looked good outwardly, but their hearts and actions did not honor God. Emphasize that God desires genuine obedience, not empty religious activities.

TRUE WORSHIP

Read Amos 5:24 together. Ask students whether their actions during the week match what they say they believe. Challenge them to choose one practical way to honor God through obedience, fairness, and kindness during the coming week.
