Terms of Adoption

If at any time the adopter feels as if they can continue to play the character no longer, it should be returned to me—the adopter should not try and find a new player on their own. Should a character fall inactive after having been adopted, I retain the right to take the account back and either shelve or re-adopt the character back out to a new player. After a character has been played consistently for six months, the account is no longer at risk of being taken back, should they fall inactive.

No matter how much time has passed since the character had been adopted, the adopter does not acquire the right to take the character over to an RPG website that is not WOLF; explicit permission from the family's creator (Kuro) must be acquired in order to do this. To request that a character be permitted to be carried over to a different website, a message explaining the reason should be sent directly to the family's creator—note that, though making said request is an option, few to no requests will actually ever be accepted.

How to Adopt

To apply for an Apaata character, please shoot me a PM by clicking <u>here</u> or a DM on Discord (Kurooo#1574). Applications should include the character's name, potential personality that you have in mind for them, any plot ideas, and why you would like to adopt said character. I will review each application and reply as soon as I am able. As the family and character creator, I have every right to decline any applications.

Extra Information

- The Apaata family is generally dominated by males, but it is still expected that they respect elders of either sex. As per tradition, the women of the Apaata family do not take the surname of their husband—this had extended to cover females outside of the family, and so males are not known to insist that their spouse take the Apaata name; if the spouse wishes to take the name, they will not usually be denied that, but the men will not demand it of them.
- · When male's come of age and begin fathering children, said children are given the Apaata name at birth, but are permitted to take their mother's surname once they've entered the adult ranks if that is something they'd like to do; the children of Apaata women can take either their father or mother's name at birth, there are no rules demanding that they carry their mother's name.
- · Polygamy and open marriages are not at all uncommon. Some members of the newer generations might not find either practices appealing, but never are they shunned. Those that practice said styles of relationships are accepted, as are those that do not.
 - · Divorce and remarriage are both acceptable, but not too common.
- · Many members of the family speak both Inuttut and English; children are given the option of learning English at a young age, but not all of them choose to learn. Some that choose to learn do better than others, resulting in varying thicknesses when it comes to accents.
- The Apaata bloodline carries the recessive genes for both *albinism* and *heterochromia*; these genes do not show often, usually needing another carrier of the recessive genes to mate with in order to produce a child with one (or, rarely, both) of these traits.
- · There are various packs led by wolves of the Apaata family spread all throughout Alaska and Canada. It is not unusual for members to leave the pack that they were born into after their first birthday and travel to settle into another Apaata pack with extended family; some set off to travel, too, and some may even seek to found their own pack.

- · Grey eyes are rare; blue and green eyes are even rarer—this does not apply when the non-Apaata parent's genes are more dominant.
 - · Children are often named after the deceased members of the family.
 - · Those that have died are buried exactly three days after taking their last breath.
