He leaves various goodies like chocolate, nuts, fruits or gummy bears inside the boots! The morning of December 6th, the children quickly jump from their beds to see if their boots are in fact full! What a fun tradition!!

Germany also loves to celebrate with festive markets throughout the country! This tradition dates back to the 15th century and there are over 2,500 markets celebrating the season across Germany!
