**FEBRUARY IS BLACK HISTORY MONTH: February** was chosen to celebrate African American History because it holds the birthdays of two people who helped eliminate slavery: Frederick Douglass and President Abraham Lincoln.



Frederick Douglass' mother was an enslaved Black woman and his father was white. Douglass taught himself to read and write, then he taught other enslaved people to read using the Bible. As word spread of his efforts to educate fellow enslaved people, he was moved to a farmer who was known for his brutal treatment of the enslaved people.

Roughly 16 at this time, Douglass was regularly whipped. Eventually, Frederick Douglass escaped slavery, becoming a prominent activist, author, and public speaker. He became a leader in the abolitionist movement, and after the Civil War, he continued to push for equality and human rights until

his death in 1895. An advocate for women's rights, and specifically the right of women to vote, Douglass' legacy as an author and leader lives on. His work served as an inspiration to the civil rights movement of the 1960s and beyond.
