



## Welcome to the Campus Librarians Network, a program of the <u>Astor Center for Public School Libraries</u> and the <u>New York City School Library System</u>

The Campus Librarians Network (CLN) is a professional learning community of NYC school librarians and teachers-assigned to the library who support secondary schools on multi-school campuses, as well as other educational professionals who support this community of practitioners.

Participating librarians engage in professional learning designed to build their capacity as instructional leaders; to strengthen their ability to advocate and use library data; to promote technology and digital tools; to share best practices and resources around curriculum support; and to work to ensure students are acquiring the information literacy skills necessary to be successful in school, college and career. The sessions offer networking and hands-on opportunities for developing library management strategies and resources.

The workshops are co-designed and co-facilitated by the Astor Center for Public School Libraries at New Visions and the New York City School Library System.

Participating librarians are expected to collaboratively explore best practices around library and curriculum work with their colleagues. In addition to sharing deliverables, library lessons, tools, projects and best practices, participating librarians can receive Young Adult books for their libraries through the New Visions & Publishers Weekly donations program.

2025-2026 Focus: Transition

School libraries are critical to teaching and learning for all students.
