I. THE VIETNAM INSTITUTE FOR ADVANCED STUDY (VIASM)

On August 19th, 2010, Prof. Ngo Bao Chau received the Fields Medal at The International Congress of Mathematicians 2010, held in Hyderabad, India. This event set the momentum for many future activities of The 10-year National Program for the Development of Mathematics (NPDM 20102-2020).

VIASM's goal is to become a center for the study of Mathematics, providing a comfortable and inspiring environment for professors, researchers, and students to the standard of countries that are leading in Math. With such an environment provided, we at VIASM hope that the Institute would encourage the exchange of knowledge among the researchers and students that will be working at VIASM, which in turn will not only help the individual researchers achieve their goals but also further advance the general knowledge and interest in math in Vietnam. Our goal aligns with the goals of the NPDM, which aims to encourage the sustainable development of Math in Vietnam as a science, contributing to the progress of Vietnam as a country as well as uplifting Vietnamese Mathematics in the global scheme.

From the founding of VIASM to March 2020, VIASM headquarter were located on the 7th floor of the Ta Quang Buu Library within the campus of Hanoi University of Science and Technology. From April 2020, VIASM moved to the official headquarters at 157 Chua Lang Street, Dong Da, Ha Noi (refurnished from what was before Nguyen Van Huyen Elementary School) with a system of conference rooms, seminar rooms, private research rooms, offices, and guest houses.

After 10 years of operating, VIASM built a sufficient working system, with a clear legal position, detailed missions, and a fully furnished facility. This proved to be a strong foundation for VIASM's future successes.

II. VISA INFORMATION

● Exemption of VISA entry to Vietnam

The Vietnam Government on Tuesday (Mar, 15, 2022) agreed to resume its unilateral visa exemption policy for citizens from 13 countries as Vietnam seeks to reopen inbound tourism after nearly two years of closure.

Citizens from Belarus, Denmark, Finland, France, Germany, Italy, Japan, Norway, Russia, South Korea, Spain, Sweden, and the U.K. will be allowed to visit Vietnam for up to 15 days without a visa regardless of passport type and entry purpose.

The Vietnam Government also announced to resume other pre-pandemic immigration procedures for foreigners and overseas Vietnamese.

If staying longer than 30 days in Vietnam, Malaysian passport holders need to get a visa.

Above is a picture of the Noi Bai Airport Arrivals Area (for international flights). If you are informed that VIASM staff will come to the airport to pick you up, please wait in the “yellow” area.

❖ From Noi Bai International Airport to VIASM

The distance from the airport to the Institute is about 28 km with a variety of travel options.

Option 1. Taxis

The fare ranges from US\$ 10-13 (VND 250,000 - VND 300,000) and the preferred payment method is in cash. Estimated travel time: 30 minutes.

Taxi ride to the city center takes about 40 minutes and costs approximately US\$ 16 –18 (350,000 - 400,000 VND) from the Noi Bai Airport to the downtown area.

Option 2. Bus Express 86

The bus operates from Noi Bai International Airport to Hanoi Railway Station (Le Duan Street). The ticket is about 1.5 USD (VND 35,000) per person with an estimated travel time of approx. 55 minutes. Once you arrive at the final stop, you can take a taxi or public transport to the Hotel with a distance of about 7 km.

Option 4: Other Transportation Apps: An easy way to book taxis or motorbikes is the ride-hailing apps such as: *Grab, Be, and Taxi Mai Linh*. Grab (and Be) are the Uber of SE Asia and can be used to reserve a car, taxi, or motorbike. Besides ride-hailing, Grab is also a great app for food delivery.

You can download the Grab/Be apps in the app store (Android | Apple) on your phone and register using your phone number, Facebook account, or Google account. It takes no more than 2 minutes to complete the registration.

2. Traveling inside the city

Taxi from the Noi Bai International Airport to the center city costs approximately US\$10 – 13 (250,000 – 300,000 VND).

Most taxis have meter & receipt, the price is about US\$0.5 – 0.8/km (12 000 – 18 000 VND/km).

❖ From downtown Hanoi to VIASM

From the direction of Nguyen Chi Thanh street: Start at Vincom Center Nguyen Chi Thanh building (54A Nguyen Chi Thanh), turn into Chua Lang street, go about 600m then turn left into lane 157B Chua Lang Street.

From the direction of Lang Street: turn into Chua Lang Street, go about 350m then turn right into lane 157B Chua Lang Street.

After turning into lane 157B Chua Lang street, go about 100m further to the main gate of the Institute - Gate No.1 (the gate on the right).

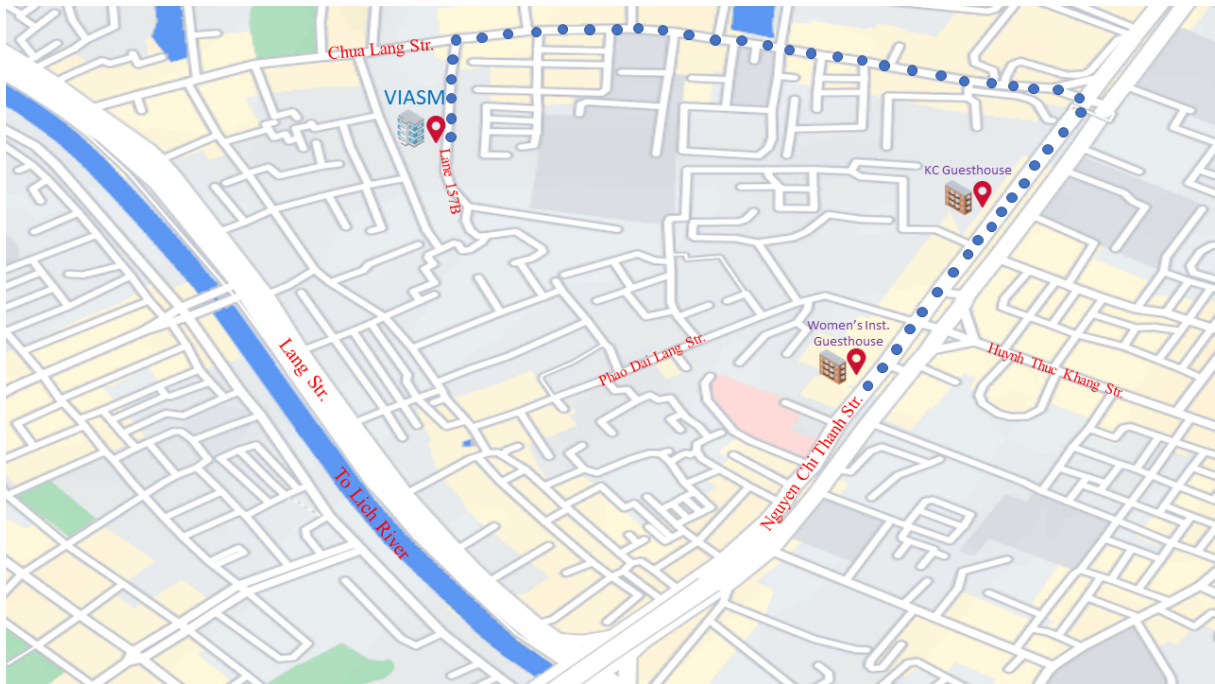
Gate No.1 will be opened from 7:00 to 19:00 daily. Outside the above time (from 19:00 to 7:00 the next day).

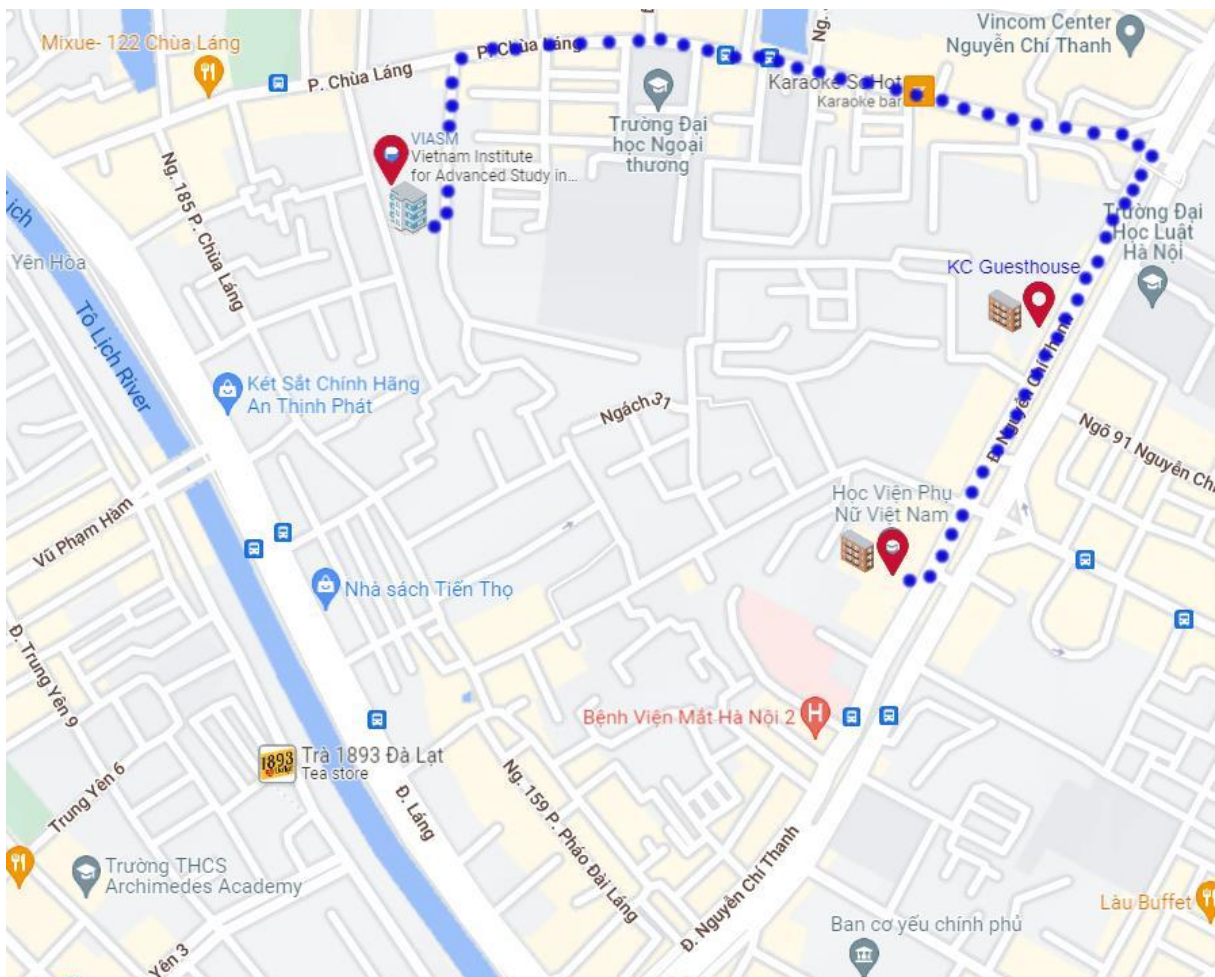

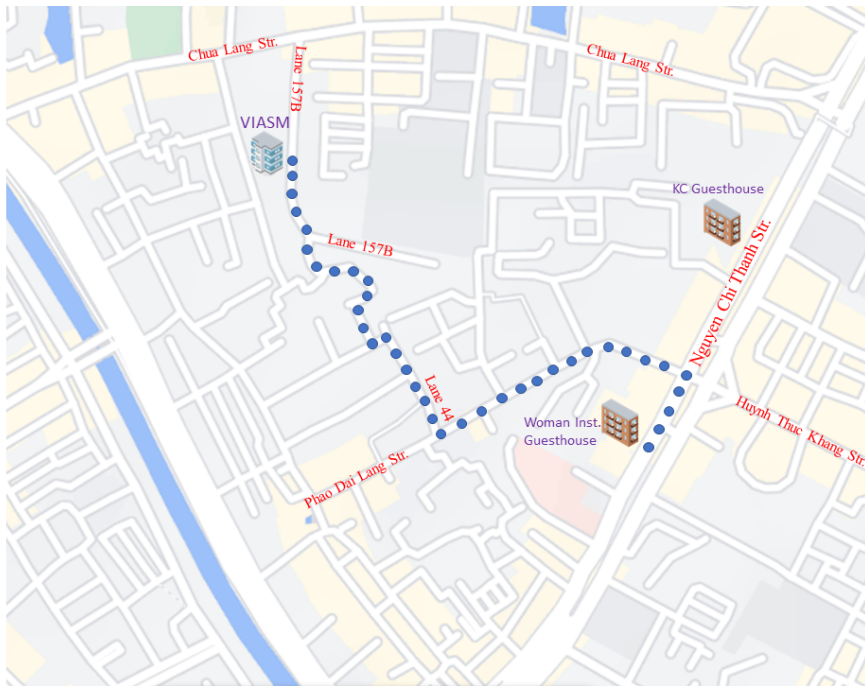
Below is map from the KC Guesthouse and Vietnam Women's Institute Guesthouse to VIASM



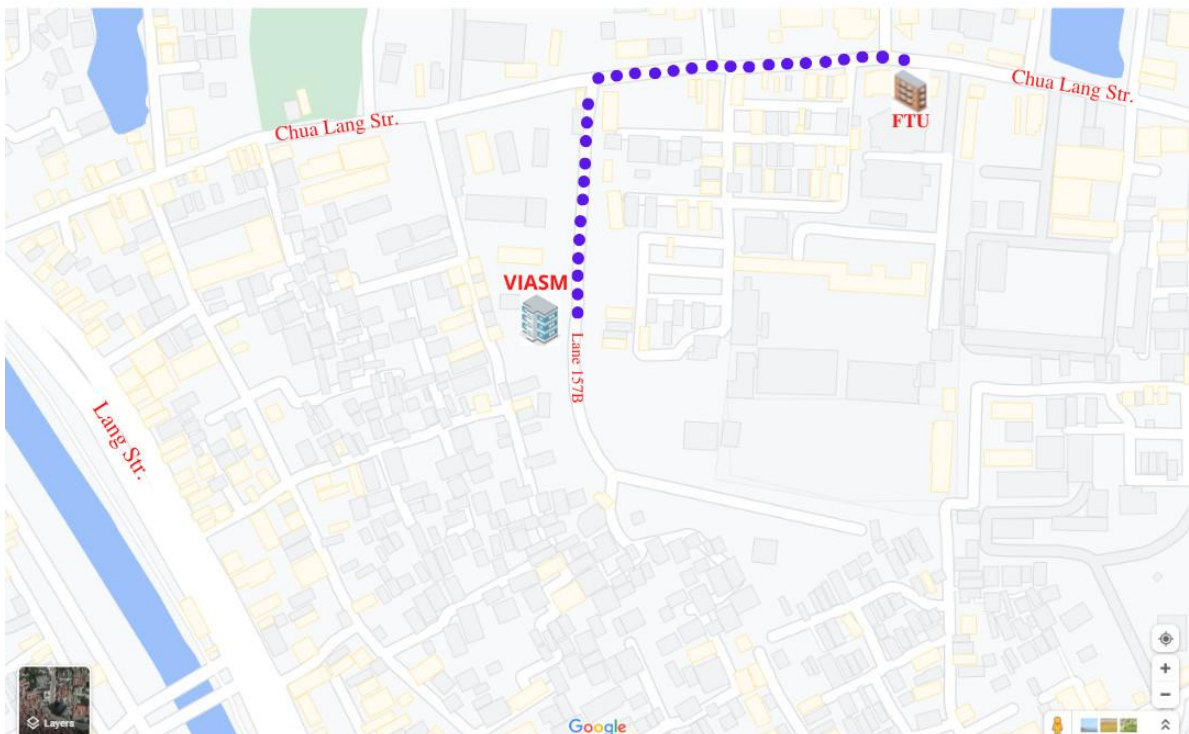

IV. SIM CARD AND CURRENCY EXCHANGE

The easiest place to buy a SIM card is at the airport when you first arrive in Vietnam. Make sure

you bring your passport when you go to purchase a SIM Card and make sure to have your cell phone unlocked for international use before you leave your home country. Expect to pay between 150,000-350,000 VND (\$6-\$15 USD) for a SIM card and prepaid data package, depending on how long you're staying in Vietnam and how much data you want. You can choose a mobile carrier that provides SIM in Vietnam such as: Viettel, MobiFone, Vinaphone, Vietnamobile.

It is best to purchase a Vietnamese SIM card either in the airport or at one of the official stores of the mobile network providers.

- ***At the Airport:*** You'll find dozens of kiosks selling SIM cards as soon as you exit the baggage claim area in any of Vietnam's international airports.
- ***At Post and telecommunication Office:*** If you have already left the airport without a SIM card then you should head directly to one of the branch offices of the telecom companies. You can find many official stores from Viettel, MobiFone, and Vinaphone (please see below).

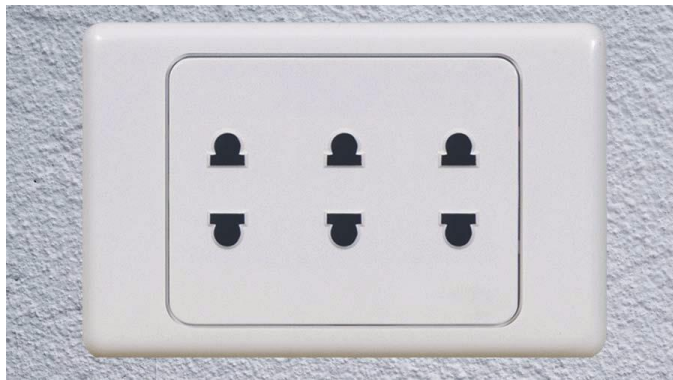

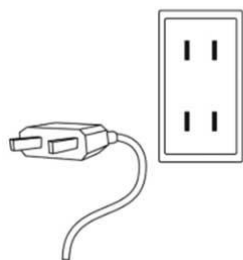

VII. ELECTRICITY

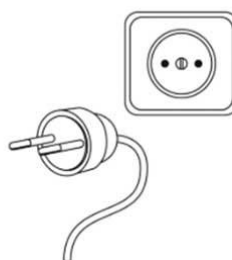
Coming to Vietnam, it is useful to know something about the electricity, for example if you need a world plug or travel adapter. This is the most common outlet:



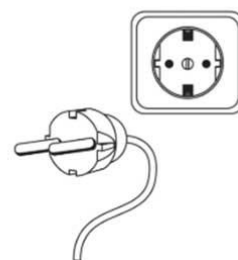
In short, plug type A (two flat vertical pins), type C and type F (two round pins) fit most sockets in Vietnam. The following 3 adapters can be used without problems in Vietnam:



Type A



Type C



Type F

When you have an adapter that fits in one of them, it means that in most hotels and guesthouses you can easily charge the battery or battery of your camera, laptop and telephone. You almost never encounter an outlet with only Type A , B or C. There are some cases where an alternating current of 110 volts is used, for which you need a “flat three-point plug”, only the chance that you will encounter it is very small.

Voltage and frequency: The electricity voltage of Vietnam is 220 Volts at 50Hz. Check if the label on your device says something similar to “100-240V 50-60Hz” or “220V 50Hz”, the device is compatible with the voltage in Vietnam.

What to do if your plugs (or right adapter) are not supported in Vietnam?

A travel adapter should be bought at home and packed in your luggage. If you have already landed in Vietnam, you can buy a world plug or travel adapter at electronic shops, electronic centers, convenience stores, and supermarkets such as: **Dien May Xanh, Nguyen Kim, Pico, Mediamart**. The price is around \$4 per adapter.

VIII. CURRENCY AND PAYMENT

Vietnamese currency: The official currency in Vietnam is the Vietnam đồng (VND), 1USD = 23,220 VND and 1 EUR = 23,550 VND. You can sometimes pay in US dollars or Euros in Vietnam (but it is not recommended). The widely accepted credit cards in Vietnam are Visa, Mastercard and American Express. You can exchange from USD or EUR to VND at the airport or at any bank in the city. You can refer to and check the exchange rate at Vietcombank's website below:

However, in general, you can hardly exchange from VND back to foreign currency in a bank. Thus, please only exchange an amount enough for the duration of your stay.

Cash withdrawal and exchange: Upon arriving in Vietnam, you'll want to have some cash in the local currency. You can find ATMs accepting international cards just outside the arrival gates at all major airports. ATMs are a common sight in Vietnamese cities, and you should have no trouble locating one in most destinations. International cards such as Visa and MasterCard are accepted at more than 20,000 ATMs nationwide. If you need help finding the nearest ATM, just ask your hotel.

Withdrawal limits per transaction range between 2 million VND (just under 100 dollars) and 3 million VND with local bank ATMs; and between 5 million VND to 10 million VND with international bank ATMs.

You can also find currency exchange vendors inside Vietnam's international airports just before the exit gates. Once you're in your destination, you can usually exchange currency at local banks such as: Eximbank, Vietcombank, Vietinbank, Agribank, Techcombank, BIDV, etc, around the city.

Card payments in Vietnam: While cash is used for small purchases and street vendors in Vietnam, most establishments accept payments from major credit card providers such as Visa. Hotels, tour operators, boutiques, restaurants, grocery stores, and spas all generally accept international debit and credit cards. Conversion rates and swiping fees will be set by your card provider.

Banh mi (called *Bánh mì* in Vietnamese):

This restaurant gained worldwide acclaim when President Obama and Anthony Bourdain ate bun cha together right here in this local, authentic and incredibly delicious place.
