- 1. Attendees need to identify with a Party Republican, Democrat, etc.) and attend the caucus for said party.
- 2. Caucus is always held the first Tuesday in February every even year.
- 3. Caucus is held at the precinct (local)level.
- 4. Candidates share their views and ideas at a caucus.
- 5. Changes to the Party platform can ne discussed during a caucus.
- 6. Delegates are chosen to attend the Conventions at the next level (County, State House, and State Senate District Endorsing)
- 7. Delegates to the endorsing conventions have the power to vote for a candidate they support that may be endorsed by the party for the upcoming elections.
- 8. Endorsed candidates and/or primary winning candidates are the names listed on the ballot in November and during the special elections.
- 9. Caucus is an excellent Ave to meet other like-minded individuals.
- 10. If you want a voice in which candidate names appear on the ballot in November, attending precinct caucus is the vital first step!
