

## **10 Facts about Caucus**

1. Attendees need to identify with a Party Republican, Democrat, etc.) and attend the caucus for said party.
2. Caucus is always held the first Tuesday in February every even year.
3. Caucus is held at the precinct (local) level.
4. Candidates share their views and ideas at a caucus.
5. Changes to the Party platform can be discussed during a caucus.
6. Delegates are chosen to attend the Conventions at the next level (County, State House, and State Senate District Endorsing)
7. Delegates to the endorsing conventions have the power to vote for a candidate they support that may be endorsed by the party for the upcoming elections.
8. Endorsed candidates and/or primary winning candidates are the names listed on the ballot in November and during the special elections.
9. Caucus is an excellent Ave to meet other like-minded individuals.
10. If you want a voice in which candidate names appear on the ballot in November, attending precinct caucus is the vital first step!
