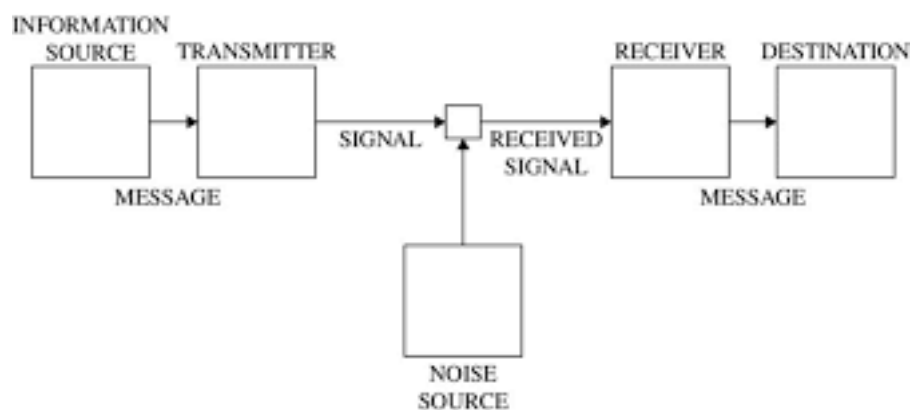


Figure 1. Shannon and Weaver's Model (source: ...)
